ORDER

Sanction is accorded to the payment of remuneration at the rate of Rs. 3/- for each script written by a scribe appointed for taking dictation from disabled candidates in all the examinations conducted by the Commissioner for Government Examinations in March/April, 1960.

The Government direct that the expenditure in the case of blind candidates be met from the provision in the budget for payment of remuneration. Candidates who need help of scribe to answer the examination papers on account of other disabilities such as accident, ill-health on the eye of Examination should be instructed to deposit with the concerned Chief Superintendent an amount at the rate of Rs. 3/- per script from which the remuneration will be paid to the scribe.

The Commissioner for Government Examinations is requested to expose the following conditions for appointment of scribe to take dictation from the blind and other handicapped candidates:-

1. Request for scribe on the grounds of stickness or any other physical disability should be supported by a Medical certificate from a Registered Medical practioner.
2. The Chief Superintendent of the Examination Centre or an officer of the Education Department not below the rank of a Deputy Inspector of schools should satisfy himself that the grounds on which a scribe is requested are genuine after seeing the candidate personally.
3. The Educational qualifications of the scribe employed should generally be the Matriculation standard the personnel employed should be realizable.
4. The expenditure payable as remuneration to the scribe into the borne by the candidate and should be deposited by him in advance, with the concerned Chief Superintendent at the rate of Rs. 3/- per script for which dictation has to be taken.
5. Blind candidates appearing for the examination and also used the assistance of scribes need not deposit any amount. The expenditure in their cases will be borne by department and the Chief Superintendent will claim the remuneration along with the remuneration payable to Assistant Superintendents.
6. The candidate for whom a scribe is employed should be seated separately so that other candidates answering the question papers may not be disturbed. Arrangement for proper supervision should be made.

7. The person acting as a scribe should only write what the candidate dictates and no assistance of any kind what so ever by way suggestion or otherwise should be given to the candidate besides writing what he dictates. The scribes will be so selected that generally speaking they are not conversant with the subjects pertaining to the candidates so that the intrinsically they are in capable of helpingthe candidates in answering the question papers.

ORDER

The Employment Advisory Committee of Special Employment Exchange for Physically Handicapped has resolved as follows.

“In respect of orthopaedically handicapped persons who lost the normal mobility of hands and fingers relaxation of time may be allowed upto 25% more than ordinarily allowed to normal boys at the public Examinations provided this relaxation is recommended by the Employment Officer concerned and certified by individual disability”.

2. The Commissioner for Government Examinations has considered the case of blind people also besides the orthopaedically handicapped persons and placed the following issues before the Board of Secondary Education:-

- i) Fixing time limit for answering questions : and
- ii) Allowing alternative questions in place of questions regarding.
 - a) drawing of diagrams in science.
 - b) Map pointing in Social studies and
 - c) Drawing of diagrams and graphs in Mathematics.

The Board of Secondary Education has considered the above issues and passed the following resolutions.

1. To allow extra time of 30 minutes to all Blind candidates and other physically Handicapped candidates : and
2. The Blind and Physically Handicapped candidates be exempted from drawing diagrams and location of boundaries and places etc., and allowed to give only the description giving full weightage to the Questions”.

The Government after careful consideration pass the following orders so far as S.S.C. Public Examinations are concerned.

1) To allow extra time of 30 Minutes to all Blind candidates and other physically handicaped candidates.

2) The blind and physically handicapped candidates be exempted from drawing diagrams and location of boundaries and places etc., and allowed to give only the description giving full weightage to the questions”.

ORDER

In the G.O. 1st read above, orders were issued exemption to the physically Handicapped (Blind, Deaf and Dumb) pupils studying in Government Institutions in Andhra Pradesh from payment of examination fee for the H.S.C., VIII standard and Technical Examinations in the State. Similar provision does not, however exist in the S.S.C. Examination Scheme approved in G.O. Ms. No. 63, Edn., dt. 16-1-69. In G.O. Ms. No. 804 Edn., dt. 3-7-75 orders were issued permitting candidates without school studies to appear for X class and VII class Examinations as private candidates. In G.O. Ms. No. 992 Edn., dt. 28.9.1976, the collection of a fee of Rs. 50/- towards exemption from attendance at schools were prescribed from all private candidates for the S.S.C., Examinations. The examination fee for X class (S.S.C.) was also brought on to a uniform rate of Rs. 25/- both regular and private candidates who appear for all subjects.

2. In this letter 4th read above, the Commissioner for Government Examinations submitted proposals.
 - i) To exempt the physically handicapped (Blind, deaf and Dumb) candidates appearing for the S.S.C. Examinations either as regular candidates from schools or as private candidates from the payment of "Examination Fee" and
 - ii) To exempt such of the above mentioned physically handicapped candidates appearing for the S.S.C. Examinations as private candidates, from the payment of "Exemption Fee" of Rs. 50/-
3. The Government after careful examination consider that the proposal of the Commissioner for Government Examinations is a welfare measure to encourage the physically handicapped persons in the field of education and to enable them acquire the minimum general educational qualifications and direct that.
 - a) The Physically handicapped students (Blind, Deaf and Dumb) be exempted from the payment of examination fee for the S.S.C. and VII Class Common Examinations in respect of both regular and private candidates.
 - b) The candidates without school study, appearing for SSC Examinations as private candidates to be exempted for payment of "Exemption Fee" and

- c) the above mentioned concession can be availed or permitted to be availed bonafide students who are handicapped on account of blindness, deafness and dumbness. The candidates shall furnish along with their application form for Examination a certificate in this regard obtained from a Civil Assistant Surgeon.
4. This order shall come into force, with effect from the March, 1980 Examinations.

ORDER

The Director of School Education, Hyderabad in her letter read above has reported that deaf children have problems in learning and as such cannot achieve expected levels of achivement as the normal children and complete deaf children may not be able to learn anything. Partially deaf children can be educated with the help of the modern gadgets and techniques available. She has, therefore, requested to Government to issue orders introducing single language to deaf children studying in schools as they have to learn by lip reading.

2. After careful examination, Government accept the proposal of Director of School Education and direct the deaf children in schools be permitted to study only one language and appear for SSC Public Examination with only one language.

ORDER

The Director, Welfare of Handicapped in his letter read above has stated that 43 Homes and Hostels for various categories of handicapped are functioning under the department of Welfare of handicapped and part-time doctors at a remuneration of Rs. 200/- p.m. are providing medical attention to the inmates of the hostels. The Director, Welfare of handicapped has further stated that the rate of remuneration to the Part-time doctors was not enhanced from 1983-84 and therefore the Doctors are not coming forward to be appointed as part-time doctors as the remuneration paid is very low.

Therefore he has requested to issue orders for enhancement of remuneration to part-time Doctors from Rs. 200/- to Rs. 500/- p.m. He has also informed that there are 27 posts of Part-time doctors and the additional funds required if the remuneration is enhanced would be Rs. 1,000/- P.A.

2. Government after careful consideration hereby order enhancing the rate of remuneration to the part-time doctors from Rs. 200/- p.m. to Rs. 350/- p.m. with effect from the date of this order. The additional amount consequent on this enhancement should be met from the detailed Head of account:-

"050-Payment to Professionals and Special Services" of the respective Sub. heads of various Homes/ Hostels by providing additional funds in the budget 1991-92.

ORDER

Instances have come to the notice of the Government that certain disabled students who failed in their Intermediate, Degree and other examinations are not vacating hostels and thereby depriving admissions to other fresh eligible candidates.

2. As per the rules of admissions and stay in the hostels for college going disabled students issued in G.O. first read above, the maximum period of stay for each intimate is 2 years for Intermediate studies and 3 years for degree students. Candidates who failed in their examinations should not be continued in the hostel.

3. Keeping in view of the instances referred to at Para 1 above, in the meeting held on 9th June, 1997, Government decided that the students who have failed in their examinations and staying in the hostels as on 9th June, 1997 are permitted to remain in the hostels for a further period of one year only i.e. upto April 31, 1998 so as to enable them to appear for supplementary examinations and if necessary for annual examinations too. Thus they are allowed to avail two chances in order to complete their courses. The candidates who pass in the ensuring supplementary examinations have to vacate the hostels Invariably.

4. Government direct that no student who failed in the Intermediate and Degree examinations and is staying in the hostel should be asked to vacate the hostel and they are allowed to continue to study in the hostel for a further period of one year i.e. for the year 1997-98 only so as to enable them to appear for supplementary examinations and if necessary for annual examinations. In case they fail to clear their examinations in the year 1997-98., they have to vacate the hostels. The students who pass in the supplementary examinations in September / October, 1997 shall vacate the hostel invariably to facilitate admissions for fresh students.

4. The general conditions governing the award of the scholarships are:

- (iii) The awardee should not be a recipient of any other scholarship. In case he/she is selected for this scholarship as well as any other scholarship, he/she will have to select one. In case he/she opts to receive the other scholarship and forego this, he/she will be entitled to receive the merit certificate and the trophy.

The expenditure for Rs. 10.00 (Rupees ten lakhs only) for organisation of the function at Hyderabad, for the trophies etc. for the participants shall be placed at the disposal of the Commissioner, Information and Public Relations. This amount shall be drawn by Commissioner Technical Education and placed at the disposal of Commissioner, Information and Public Relations and Managing Director, A.P, Film Development Corporation.

8. The C & DSE will implement the scheme for the awardees, under 7th class Common Examination and S.S.C. Public Examination EDCET, DIETCET AND PECET. The C and DIE will implement the scheme for the awardness pertaining to Intermediate / CBSE / ICSE Public Examination. The Commissioner of Technical Education will implement the scheme for the awardees pertaining to EAMCET, MBACET, MCACET, ECET, CEEP and National level Entrance Examinations for Professional courses and Commissioner of Collegiate Education for LAW CET.

9. The Commissioner and Director of School Education, Commissioner & Director of Intermediate Education, Commissioner of Technical Education and Commissioner of Collegiate Education are authorised to draw and disburse the amount pertaining to the examination / entrance tests as mentioned in para 8 above. The amount sanctioned in para 6 above shall be incurred in relaxation of Treasury Control Order and Quarterly regulation subject to recoupment by sanction of additional funds under the relevant Head of Accounts through supplementary estimates at the appropriate time. Cost of travel, boarding etc. and cost of organising the function will be borne equally between the School Education and Higher Education budget.

10. Regarding operationalisation of the award, the student shall apply in the prescribed application form to the Principal concerned of the institution where the student is admitted after passing the qualifying examination / Entrance Test. The Principal concerned will forward the application to the concerned Commissioner as mentioned in para 8 above, and receipt of the application, the Commissioner concerned will sanction the "Pratibha" award in one instalment which will be sent to the Principal through A/c payee D.D. in the name of the Student and the Principal will disburse the same to the awardee under acknowledgement to the concerned Commissioner.

11. The Commissioner and Director of School Education, Commissioner and Director of Intermediate Education, Commissioner of Technical Education and Commissioner of Collegiate Education shall obtain and furnish

supplementary estimates during the current year from all the concerned and send the same to the Government in a consolidated form for recouping the amount.

12. Approximate financial expenditure and number of recipients for the next 5 years is given in Annexure - I. The expenditure for the year 1999-2000 for this item works out to Rs. 258.75 lakhs and the total expenditure on this item for 5 years works out to Rs. 3463.75 lakhs.

13. A function will be organised at Hyderabad to give this award for the year 1999-2000 wherein all the awardees will be presented the Merit Certificate and the trophy. The awardees will be paid a lumpsum amount to cover their costs of travel, boarding and lodging at the following rates.

2. The jumbling system in examinations for all classes should be abolished in respect of these students and trained teachers should only attend the valuation of answer papers.
3. The scribe for the Blind should be X Standard.
4. The exemptions to Deaf students to study only one language and exemptions of fee and Half-an-hour extra time in each subject should be extended to all the class i.e. VI to X.

After careful examination of the representation from orthopedically challenged students, and reference cited, Government hereby decide to extend direct loan to severely challenged students who are studying Higher Education/ Professional courses for improved prosthetic aids, motorized tricycles etc., from the funds given to the Managing Director, A.P. Vikalangula Cooperative Corporation with the following conditions:

- (a) Rs. 5000/- may be given as incentive subsidy and the balance amount not exceeding Rs. 60,000/- per student may be given as direct loan to be recovered in monthly installments in three (3) years, payable from two (2) years of completion of the course or on student concerned securing a placement/job, whichever is earlier.
- (b) A committee comprising of commissioner, Disabled Welfare/ Managing Director, A.P. Vikalangula Cooperative Corporation and representative of prominent NGO Smt. - ii) The College Managements/University shall not collect fees from the eligible differently abled students at the time of counseling/ admission as the same shall be reimbursed to the institutions by Departments concerned.
- iii) For differently abled eligible students belonging to SC/ST/BC Minority the applications of candidates shall be processed and amount sanctioned and reimbursed by those departments concerned.
- iv) In respect of differently abled eligible students other than SC/ST/BC Minority, the applications shall be processed and sanctioned by the Assistant Director/ Commissioner Department for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens concerned.

4. The Commissioner, Department for the welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens, Hyderabad Shall be taken necessary action accordingly.

ORDER

In the representation read above, Samrita Trust, NGO have informed that their trust has supplied audio books of subjects of Intermediate and B.A degree courses to visually challenged students in 18 Junior and Degree colleges in A.P., and plan to supply the audio books to 20 more colleges in A.P. during June/ July, 2008 to make audio books available to about 1000 visually handicapped students in A.P. It is further informed that audio books for competitive examinations conducted by APPSC, DSC Diploma in education and B.Ed. Courses are being produced and will be made available to visually challenged students in A.P. to enhance employment potential and opportunities. A.C.D. Players and audio books in the hands of every college student will therefore help the student not only to do well in examinations of Inter and B.A. Courses, but also pass competitive examinations of Govt. of A.P. and other agencies to get employment on merit.

2. After careful examination of the above, Government feels that portable CD players will serve dual purpose of accessing quality education and improving employability capability of visually challenged students and hereby issue the following orders :

- (i) A committee headed by Commissioner Disabled Welfare with Managing Director, A.P. Vinklangula Co-operative Corporation as convener and Sri. N.S. Sastry, Managing Trustees, of Samrita Trust will review & plan the requirement. Procurement, distribution of CD players to the eligible students. The tenure of N.G.O. representative is Sri. N.S. Sastry will be for a period of two years to start with. The committee will also take appropriate steps to ensure that the CDs for all the subjects are made /copied, updated from time to time & supplied to the students concerned for every subject and maximum possible competitive examinations in a timely manner every year.
- (ii) The total expenditure incurred by APVCC for the CD players and preparation and supply of CDs of a. Subjects to each student as envisaged above shall not exceed Rs.1,500/-
- (iii) portable MP 3 CD player shall be procured as per procedure and issued by APVCC to every visually handicapped student in the 1st year Intermediate, 1st year Degree and 1st year P.G. Course for their use as a personal assistive device. For this year all students i.e., even those pursuing 2nd year Intermediate, Degree and PG 3rd year Degree will be also given C.D. players, but they shall not be provided C.D. players for subsequent years of their courses. Students pursuing Intermediate and subsequently Degree and post Graduate shall be given C.D. players upto maximum of two times only in their entire 5-6 years of study.
- (iv) The issue of this assistive device along with all other benefits shall be computerized and monitored accordingly, so that such benefits to reach maximum number of students.
- (v) The C.D. players be issued to all visually handicapped students accordingly in Government colleges through the Principals of the Colleges to ensure that bonafide visually handicapped students get the CD players and their use by the students is supervised by the Principals. The Principals are to submit details of visually handicapped students to whom CD players are given by 31 July every year to APVCC for computerized record. In addition the Principals are to submit results of visually handicapped students in the final examinations also to MD., APVCC who will ensure periodical collection computerized and updation of results.

- (vi) Audio books of syllabus for each visually handicapped student is the responsibility of the Principals of the Colleges where they are enrolled. Hence the Colleges will make copies of audio books supplied by Samrita Trust and issue one relevant set to each visually handicapped student like books from the library. Computers available in the Colleges also can be used for this purpose.
- (vii). The expenditure of this shall be met from the existing budget earmarked for educational aids. Meeting expenditure from within the budget allocation.
- (viii) The CD players provided to the colleges by NGOs will be kept in the audio book library and issued to students at the beginning of academic year and taken back after examination for re- issue in subsequence years.
- (ix). Any misuse of diversation of funds provided for this purpose shall entail stringent action against all concerned apart from prosecution if warranted.

3. Considering the volume of books and need for assistive devices for visually handicapped students in classes 9 and 10, tape recorders with radio shall be given to every visually handicapped student in class 9 and 10 through the Headmasters of the schools by APVCC. APVCC will also produce and issue one set of audio cassette tapes of the books in syllabus to each students in classes 9 and 10. The date of all such students shall be computerized and monitored by APVCC.

4. The Commissioner, Department for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens, Hyderabad shall monitor and ensure necessary procurement by Managing Director, APVCC accordingly, Following prescribed procedure and report progress on implementation to the Government.

2. Vide ref. 4th read above, orders were issued enhancing the Annual Income Ceiling of parents/Guardian for eligibility for claiming scholarships and reimbursement of fees etc., to Rs.1.00 Lakh per annum.

3. Vide ref.5th read above, orders were issued enhancing the Post-Matric scholarships rates and reimbursement of fees with effect from the year 2008-2009, to differently abled eligible students on par with Scheduled Caste students.

4. Government after careful consideration, hereby extend all the benefits of enhanced Post-Matric scholarships and reimbursement of fees etc., to complete orphans whose caste is not known on par with Scheduled Castes with effect from the year 2008-2009 as per the following guide lines :-

- a) The complete orphans whose caste status is not known and who are inmates of Institutions shall be categorized as "caste less" and shall be eligible for Post- Matric Scholarships and reimbursement of tuition fees etc., on par with Scheduled Caste students. However, reimbursement of tuition fees on par with scheduled caste students shall be admissible to all such students, who are selected for category 'A' seats only in all professional courses.
- b) The orphans who have completed their schooling all through in Govt., orphanages/Homes/Institutions or such Institutions recognized by the Govt., shall be eligible
- c) The applications of such complete orphans shall be certified by the Head of the Institutions concerned and counter signed by Child Development Project Officer concerned after proper enquiry and verification of connected records. The project Director, District Women & Child Development Agency of the District shall have all such applications cross checked and personally verify wherever warranted and submit the same to the Director WD & CW. The Director shall sanction the same and reimburse the fees to the Institutions/Colleges concerned..
- d) The college Managements/University shall not collect Fees from such orphans at the time of counseling/admission as the same shall be reimbursed to the Institutions by Director, Women Development & Child Welfare Department concerned.
- e) Furnishing of false information or certification shall entail prosecution against concerned, in addition to disciplinary action for major punishment where Govt., staff are involved.

- f) The information regarding sanction of Post-Matric Scholarships & Reimbursement of Tuition Fees and Special Fees, College-wise and Student - wise shall be made available on the web site.
- 5) The Director, Women Development & Child Welfare Department, Commissioner, Dept. for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens and the Commissioner, Juvenile Welfare, Correctional Services and Welfare of street Children, Hyderabad shall take necessary action accordingly.

- c) The annual income limit of parents/guardians for eligibility has been enhancement from 24,000/- per annum to Rs.1,00,000/- per annum.
- d) The guidelines for procedure etc., to be followed for sanction of Pre- matric Scholarships is as at Annexure.
- e) The enhanced rates of scholarships and enhanced income ceiling into from the year 2008-09.
4. The Commissioner, Dept. for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens, Hyderabad was already instructed to computerized the entire procedure apart from allocating a unique number to every scholarship holder/ disabled to facilities tracking of all benefits received by him, as well as his/ her performance. The Commissioner shall finalize and operationalize the software package accordingly.
5. The Commissioner, Dept. for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens, Hyderabad is requested to utilize the budget provision available, explore the possibility for re -appropriation and then come up for additional funds, if necessary at the appropriate time.
6. The Commissioner Dept. for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens, Hyderabad shall taken necessary action accordingly.

GUIDELINES FOR PRE-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIPS

OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the Scheme is to provide Financial Assistance to the Disabled students studying at Pre-matric Courses from Class I to X to enable them to complete their education.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Disabled students belonging to A.P. State who are pursuing Pre- matric Courses in Government Institutions in Andhra Pradesh
2. The Commissioner/Director, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare shall issue a notification in the leading newspapers before 30th June every year calling upon the eligible disabled students to apply for fresh pre-matric Scholarships.
3. The notification shall also be put on the notice board of the offices of Assistant Directors, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare and through Press release in district editions of local New Papers by the Assistant Directors, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare.
4. The Commissioner/Director Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare shall get the adequate number of Scholarship application forms printed and supplied to the Assistant Directors, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare for onward supply to the students through the Head of the institutions concerned. The application shall also be placed on Website of department with facility to download the same.
5. The eligible disabled students shall apply for scholarships in the prescribed proforma issued by the Commissioner/Director, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare and shall submit the application duly filled in to the Head of institution concerned on or before 30th September every year along with photographs.
6. The Assistant Directors, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare shall verify all the applications received from Government and all other recognized schools with reference to the Original transfer Certificate, income Certificate and Disability Certificate wherever necessary and other information with reference to Admission register based on verification and endorsement of the Head of the Institution and place the list before the Selection Committee headed by Joint Collector as Chairperson, D.E.O. and Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare as members of the Selection Committee.
7. In case of gap of 2 years or more in the study of the applicant the sanctioning authority shall sanction the scholarships on production of gap certificate issued by head of Institution.

INCOME ELIGIBILITY:

Scholarships and fee reimbursement will be made to the Disabled students subject to the following income ceilings

1. Disabled Students pursuing pre-matric course from I to X classes are eligible for scholarships and other allowances as mentioned in the G.O., if the annual income of parents/guardian is below Rs.1,00,000/- per annum.

SANCTION, DRAWAL AND DISBURSEMENT

1. The Assistant Director, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare shall be Drawing Officer. The Head Masters of the concerned institutions shall be Disbursing Officers.
2. The Assistant Director, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare sanctions Scholarships and presents institution wise bills to the treasury as per the norms for all Government and Other recognized Institutions.i.e.. first for Government schools, aided and unaided schools in the order of priority.

3. On issue of cheques by the Treasury, the cheques are entered in Cheque Issue Register and distributed to be Heads of the institutions.
4. The Scholarship amount of the students are disbursed to the students through Accounts Payee cheques by the Heads of the institutions.
5. Acquittances' for the amount disbursed have to be submitted by the institutions before subsequent sanctions to the institutions.
6. Budget for sanction of Pre Matric scholarships is released by the Commissioner of Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare every quarter.
7. The names of students who are sanctioned scholarships with the amounts sanctioned shall be displayed in the notice board of the institutions concerned and in the district offices apart from being placed on Web-Site of the District and Directorate of Department of Disabled and Senior Citizens Welfare.
8. The Head of Institutions shall fix the date for the purpose of disbursement of Scholarships under intimation to the Assistant Director, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare concerned and disburse the scholarships cheques on the date fixed in the presence of the students and parents.
9. A passport size photograph of the scholarship holder showing the disability shall be pasted on the acquittance register for proper identification.
10. The un-disbursed amount from any institution shall be sent to the Assistant Director, Disabled & Senior Citizens Welfare. The same amounts shall be sanctioned to the students who are next in merit in the same or other institution for the same year, with the approval of the Selection Committee. In case of non- availability of candidates, the same shall be remitted to the Government Account concerned through Challan Immedicately.
11. **Severe action shall be taken against the staff /Institutions processing bogus applications for sanction of scholarships by de- recognizing the institutions besides disciplinary action and launch of prosecution against the head of the institutions/staff concerned by the Supervisory Officers. Any negligence in this regard will entail appropriate action against Supervisory Officers.**
12. The institutions shall keep the Original pass Certificates with the institutions till the completion of the course to avoid parallel admissions of students in several institutions simultaneously.

VII INSPECTION

The Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare shall carry out inspection of the institutions. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare should depute the officer of the department not below the rank of Deputy Director for surprise field visits/random inspections.

VIII REVIEW BY DISTRICT COLLECTORS

The District Collectors shall review periodically with the Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare and the concerned officers of Education and other Department to ensure that the objective of the scheme of Scholarships is fully achieved and to sort out problems if any.

IX ACTION ON DEFAULTING INSTITUTIONS

Wherever the Disabled Welfare Department inform the Education and other departments/District Collector about any Irregularities or malpractices reported by the management of the institutions, the Education and other departments shall take prompt action to derecognizing or black- list such institutions, apart from other appropriate action.

X ACQUITTANCE

The Head of the Institutions /Principal /Head Master shall send the acquittance for the cheques disbursed along with cheques for un disbursed amount if any to the Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare with in 10 days from the date of disbursement. One copy of the acquittance shall be kept in the Educational Institutions. The Head

of the Institutions shall send a list of students to whom sdcholarships were sanctioned giving the year, name, address, class, amount sanctioned, cheque particulars to Assistant Directors, Disabled Welfare. The same should be placed on the web-site of the District Office and Directorate.

RECONCILIATION

The Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare shall reconcile the expenditure figures with the Commissioner, Disabled Welfare once in half year in order to ensure that no excess amounts are drawn under Scholarships. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare shall send annual reconcillation report of all the districts to Government by end of April every year.

REVIEW BY THE COMMISSIONER / ASSISTANT DIRECTOR:

- a. The Assistant Directors, Disabled Welfare shall update the status report regarding Scholarships by 5th of every month and e-mail to the Commissioner, Disabled Welfare.
- b. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare shall review the sanctions, drawals and disbursement of funds by 15th of every month and take appropriate corrective measures apart from arranging random field verification.
- c. The Head of the Institutions shall furnish or place on their website results of scholarship holders giving particulars of results secured by each student to Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare who in turn shall e-mail/furnish to Commissioner, Disabled Welfare/Upload on website
- d. The Commissioner/Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare shall review success rate of Scholarship holders annually.
- e. The Commissioner/ Assistant Director, Disabled Welfare shall monitor and ensure timely disbursement of scholarships to the students.

In the reference 1st read above the Register, Osmania University, Hyderabad has stated that Mr.S.Soogoorappa, a Mentally Handicapped student of Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) 5 YDC admitted during the academic year 2003-2004 at Sri Venkateshwara College of Fine Arts was detained in III year during 2005-06. Mr.S.Soogoorappa has submitted an application for exemption from appearing and passing of one Language i.e. English Paper at his BFA Course.

2. The Registrar, Osmania University has further stated that in respect of Deaf and Dumb students who have been exempted from appearing one Language (i.e. English or Second Language)at S.S.C. and Intermediate level, the University has been extending the relaxation for exemption of one language (i.e. English or Second Language)at Degree Level. He has further stated that the Standing Committee of the Academic Senate at its meeting held on 15-11-2007 discussed the matter and resolved to write a letter to Government with regard to one language exemption at BFA Course for the mentally handicapped students on par with deaf and Dumb candidates.

3. The Registrar, Osmania University Hyderabad has requested the Government to clarify whether the Mentally Handicapped students may also be considered for exemption from appearing one Language (English or Second Language) at degree level on par with Deaf and Dumb candidates.

4. Government have examined the matter and observe that there are several parents, whose children are suffering from Cerebral, palsy, Dyslexia, etc., mental handicaps and approaching Government for relaxation in respect of Public Exams i.e. exemption from one language paper. Extra time to write the papers (30 minutes-1hour) Scribe help etc. Keeping in view the above., Government have decided to extend the following exemptions to the Mentally Handicapped candidates at degree level on par with Deaf and Dumb candidates:

1. Appearing from one language paper (English or Second Language)
 2. Extra-time to write the papers(30minutes - 1 hour),and Scribe help.

After careful examination of the representations for providing laptops to Visually Handicapped Students, Government is convinced that laptops will serve dual purposes of providing access to quality education and enhance employability of visually Handicapped students studying professional courses in colleges.

Therefore, Government hereby issue the following orders:-

- (i) A Committee headed by Commissioner, Department for the Welfare of Disabled & Senior Citizens with Managing Director, A.P. Vikalangula Co-Operative Corporation as convenor and Sri N.S. Sastry, Managing Trustee of Samrita Trust will identify professional courses and after due verification select a suitable laptop, plan requirement, and distribution of laptops to eligible Visually Handicapped Students.
 - (ii) The tenure of NGO representative, Sri N.S.Sastry, will be for a period of two years to start with.
 - (iii) Laptops shall be procured as per procedure and issued through APVCC to every eligible Visually Handicapped Student pursuing professional courses for their use as a personal assistive device.
 - (iv) The issue of this assistive device along with other benefits shall be computerized and monitored accordingly, so that the benefits reach maximum number of Visually Handicapped students and there is transparency in the process. Progress of Visually Handicapped students issued with laptops in education and employment shall be obtained from the Visually Handicapped Students as feedback on benefits of the laptops to Visually Handicapped Students.
 - (v) The expenditure of procurement of laptops for Visually Handicapped students shall be met from the existing budget ear marked for educational aids etc. within the budget allocation.
 - (vi) Andhra Pradesh Technology Services shall procure the laptops with screen reader software as per requirement communicated by the Committee constituted at para 2 (i), within one month of receiving such communication.
 - (vii) Any misuse or diversion of funds provided for this purpose shall entail stringent action against all concerned.
 - (viii) The Managing Director, APVCC shall ensure necessary procurement of laptops and their issue following prescribed procedure and report progress on implementation to the Government.

Tirupathi run by TTD as a statewide institution as in the case of Junior College for Hearing Handicapped at Bapatla, Guntur District so as to provide admissions to the Hearing Handicapped students from other districts of Andhra Pradesh also.

2. After careful examination of the proposal and taking into consideration requests made accordingly from different quarters, Government hereby declare the S.V. Junior College for Deaf& Dumb, Tirupathi run by Tirumal Tirupathi Devasthanams as a Statewide Institute for providing education and other facilities ancillary to it including the recruitment of Teaching and Non Teaching Staff.

ORDER:

Government have considered the matter relating to the criteria that require to be laid down for drawing up of priorities among the Physically handicapped' so that preference is given interest even amongst the physically handicapped' within the reserved quota for admission to various courses in the Universities .

After detailed discussions with some experts it was decided that the following priorities shall be drawn up in regard to Physically Handicapped Persons.

First priority to those with visual defects;

Second priority to those who have defects of the upper limbs; and

Third priority to those with defects in the lower limbs.

In pursuance of the above decisions, the classification in regard to the above priorities shall be as follows:-

Visual defect: A person can be said to be visually handicapped if the vision is from 6/18 upto 6/60 and anything less than 6/60 shall be considered as an extreme handicap. The above criteria shall also be made applicable to persons with vision in both the eyes defects indicated above.

(2) Second Priority Defects of Upper Limbs:

(a) Quadriplegic (loss of use 4 limbs) shall be considered as the top-most priority in this category

(b) Loss of both limbs: - Preference shall be given to loss of upper Limbs from the above downwards.

(3) Third Priority: Defects of Lower Limbs

The criteria applicable to upper limbs shall also be applied to lower limbs with preference to be given for the loss of limbs from above downwards.

(4) Fourth priority: The loss of one eye or one Upper Limb or one lower Limb shall be given a priority.

In the case of individuals ,who have defects of more than one type or categorized above, each case will have to be decided on the merits after consulting the nearest Government Teaching Hospital. However,. in order to establish the defects, even such individual shall be referred to the Specialist concerned in the nearest Teaching Government Hospital for an expert Opinion.

All the Universities in the State are requested to keep in view of the above decisions at the time of admissions of Physically Handicapped Persons to the courses of study within the reserved seats in the Universities.

The Director, Welfare of handicapped in his letter third read above has requested to issue instructions to all Heads of Departments to launch a special recruitment drive for Physically Handicapped.

2. In the circumstances Government after careful consideration hereby issue orders to launch a special recruitment drive for the Physically' Handicapped i.e. the Visually handicapped, the Hearing Handicapped and Orthopaedically Handicapped including leprosy cured as per the definitions prescribed for handicapped. All the Collectors and the Heads of Departments are requested to recruit only Physically Handicapped candidates to the extent of vacancies reserved and available for them in public employment in first week of December 1992 duly and strictly following the trifurcation of 3% reservation for the Handicapped.

3. They are also requested to fill up all the backlog vacancies reserved for Handicapped, category-wise under the rule of trifurcation in first week of December, 1992 and send the report to Government by 25.12.1992 regarding number of backlog vacancies in the departments/Public Enterprises and number of vacancies filled up category-wise.

4. They are also requested to report to the Government the Number of vacancies existing in the departments/ Public Enterprises and number by first week of December, 1992

5. They are also requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the appointing authorities under their administrative control and ensure effective and strict implementation of the orders. A list of jobs identified for various handicapped persons is enclosed to make the job of employers easy in filling up of the vacancies.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by the provision to article 309 of the Constitution of India and of all other powers here unto enabling the Governor of Andhra pradesh hereby makes the following amendments to the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service rules ..

AMENDMENTS

In the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service rules,' for rule 22 and rule, 22A, the following shall be substituted respectively.

RULE 22, SPECIAL REPRESENTATION (RESERVATION)

1. Reservation may be made for appointments to a service, class or category in favour of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Back ward classes, Women, Physically handicapped, mementorious Sportsmen, Ex-service-men and such other categories, as may be prescribed by the Government from time to tome, to the extent and in the manner specified here in ,after in these rules or as the case may be, in the special rules. The principle of reservation as here in after provided shall apply to all appointments to a service, class or category.

i) By direct recruitment, except where the Government by or General or special order made in this behalf, exempt such service, class or category

ii) Otherwise than by direct recruitment, where the special rules lay down specifically that the principle of reservation in so far as it relates to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes only shall apply to such service, class or category to the extent specified therein.

2. a) The unit of appointments for the purpose of this rule shall be one hundred vacancies of which fifteen shall be reserved for Scheduled Castes, Six shall be reserved for scheduled Tribes, Twenty five shall be reserved for the Back ward Classes *and* the remaining fifty four appointments shall be made on the basis of open competition and subject to rule 22 -A of these rules.

b) Out of fifty-four appointments to be made on the basis of open competition, three appointments shall be reserved for direct recruitment of the physically handicapped persons.

c) In the case of appointment to clerical posts including the posts of typists i.e., in Group II and Group IV services and in the case of posts in the Andhra Pradesh Police Subordinate Service to which the principle of

reservation of appointments applies, out of fifty four as the case may be, fifty one appointments to be made on the basis of open-competition, two appointments, shall be reserved for direct recruitment of Ex-servicemen.

d) In the case of appointment to the posts of Senior Assistants, Junior Assistants, Junior Stenographers, Typists and Record Assistants in the offices of Heads of Departments, Assistant Section officers, Typist-Cum-Assistants, Junior Stenographers and Record Assistants in the Secretariat to which the principle of reservation of appointments applies, out of fifty four, as the case may be forty nine appointments to be made on the basis of open competition, one appointment shall be reserved to direct recruitment of meritorious sportsmen.

Provided that the claims of members of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Backward Classes, women and the Physically handicapped persons or the Ex-servicemen as the case may be shall also be considered for the remaining appointments which shall be filled on the basis of open competition, the number of appointments reserved for that category shall in no way be affected during the period of reservation for that category is in force.

Provided that:

In the case of appointments to a post referred to in sub-rule (c), the 12th and 37th turns in each unit of hundred vacancies shall be reserved for ex-servicemen. However, wherever the special or adhoc rules provided that there shall be no reservation for ex-servicemen or if a qualified and suitable candidate is not available "from ex-servicemen, . the turn allotted to ex-servicemen shall be deemed to be allotted to Open Competition.

The 6th, 31st and 56th turns in each unit of hundred vacancies shall be allotted to the physically handicapped persons and where qualified and suitable candidates are not available from among the physically handicapped persons, the turn allotted for them in the unit referred to above, shall be carried forward for three succeeding recruitment years and the reservation for these vacancies shall cease thereafter.

(i) The reservation in the case of backward Classes (Group-A), (Group-B), (Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) and Physically handicapped persons shall be in force for the period commencing from the 23rd September, 1990 to 22nd September, 2000.

(ii) If in any recruitment, qualified candidates belonging to the scheduled castes, Scheduled Tribes, backward Classes (Group-A), (Group-B), (Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) and women are not available for appointment to any or all the vacancies reserved for them, a limited recruitment confined to candidates belonging to them shall be made immediately after the general recruitment to select and appoint qualified candidates from among the persons belonging to these communities to fill such reserved vacancies.

(iii) (i) If in any; recruitment, qualified candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribes or, Backward Classes (group-A), (Group-B), (Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women are not available for appointment to all or any of the vacancies reserved for them even after conducting a limited recruitment as specified in sub-rule (g), such vacancies or vacancy; may; be allotted to the Open Competition after obtaining the permission of the Government and may, thereafter, be filled by a candidate or candidates selected on the basis of open competition.

(ii) Where any vacancies reserved for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A), (Group-B), (Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or women are so filled by candidates belonging to other communities, an equal number of vacancies shall be reserved in the succeeding recruitment for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women in addition to the vacancies that may be available for that recruitment for them and if in the said succeeding recruitment year also, qualified candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women are not available for appointment all or any of the additional vacancies which are so, reserved in that succeeding recruitment year an equal number of vacancies shall again be reserved in the next succeeding recruitment year for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may; be (Group-D) or Women in addition to the number of vacancies that may be available for the next succeeding recruitment for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women.

Provided that if in the said second succeeding recruitment also no qualified candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women are available for appointment to all or any of the additional vacancies which are so reserved in that succeeding recruitment year, an equal number of vacancies shall again be reserved in the next

succeeding recruitment for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women in addition to the number of vacancies that may be available for the next succeeding recruitment for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women.

Provided further that in the third succeeding recruitment if qualified candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes or as the case may be Scheduled Castes, are not available, a vacancy reserved to be filled by a candidate belonging to Scheduled Tribes may be filled by a candidate belonging to Scheduled Castes and a vacancy reserved to be filled by a candidate belonging to Scheduled Castes may be filled by a candidate belonging to Scheduled Tribes and if a qualified candidate belonging to a particular group of Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) is not available for appointment, the vacancy reserved to that group shall accrue to the next group.

Provided further that if after three successive recruitments, if no candidate belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women is available, such vacancy will be treated as de-reserved.

If any additional vacancy or vacancies reserved in favour of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes (Group-A), (Group-B), (Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) or Women in any recruitment in accordance with the provisions in clause (ii), appointments thereto shall be made before the appointments in the order of rotation for the relevant recruitments are made.

(i) At no selection for recruitment other than any limited recruitment made in accordance with the provisions of sub-rule(g), the number of reserved- vacancies including the additional vacancies reserved under sub-rule(h), shall exceed 52% of the total number of vacancies for the selection, and all vacancies in excess of 52% of the total number of vacancies for which recruitment is made on any particular occasion shall, notwithstanding anything in this rule, be treated as unreserved.

Provided further that the carry forward vacancies and current reserved vacancies in a recruitment year shall be available for utilization even where the total number of such reserved vacancies exceeds 52% of the vacancies filled in that recruitment, in case the overall representation of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Backward Classes (Group-A), (Group-B), (Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) and Women in the total strength of the concerned grade or cadre, has not reached and prescribed percentage of reservation of 15% for the Scheduled Castes, 6% for the Scheduled Tribes, 7% for Backward Classes (Group-A),10% for Backward Class(Group-B),1 % for Backward Classes (Group-C) 7% for Backward classes (Group-D) respectively.

(j) Where there is only a single solitary post born on the class, or category of a service, the rule of special representation shall not apply for appointment to such post, notwithstanding anything contained in the forgoing sub-rules.

Provided that the rule of special representation shall be applicable for appointment if the number of posts born on the cadre, category or grade is more than one, even though selection is to be made against only one vacancy at any recruitment other than limited recruitment.

(k) In respect of appointments by promotion or recruitment by transfer from Subordinate Service to State Service, where such appointments or recruitment by transfer is required to be made on the principle of merit and ability, seniority being considered only where merit and ability are approximately equal, the claims of any members of the Scheduled castes and Tribes shall be considered for such appointment on the basis of seniority subject of fitness.

Provided that a member of the Scheduled Caste or the Scheduled Tribe possessing superior merit and ability shall be allowed to supersede not only others but also the members of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes as the case may be.

NOTE:

1. The principle of carry forward of vacancies in respect of the Backward Classes (Group-A),(Group-B),(Group-C) and as the case may be (Group-D) shall be with effect from the 18th March, 1998.
2. The Principle of carry forward of vacancies in respect of women shall be with effect from the 28th October 1998.

3. The Principle of roster points for women candidates shall be with effect from the 1st August 1996.

II. Rule 22-A women reservation in Appointments:

Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules or special rules or adhoc rules:

1. In the matter of direct recruitment to posts for which women are better suited than men, preference shall be given to women.

2. In the matter of direct recruitment to posts for which women and men are equally suited, there shall be reservation to women to an extent of 33 1/3 % of the posts in each category of Open Competition, Backward Classes (Group-A), Backward Classes (Group-B), Backward Classes (Group-C), Backward Classes (Group-D), Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Handicapped and Ex-servicemen quota.

3. In the matter of direct recruitment to posts which are reserved exclusively for being filled by women, they shall be filled ,by women only.

1. The principle of reservation for women candidates to the extent of 30% in 'the matter of direct recruitment shall be from 02.01.1984 to 27.05.1996 (G.O.Ms.No.928, -General Administration (Services-D) Department, dated 06.10.1995).

2. The principle of reservation for women candidates to the extent of 33 1/3 % in the matter of direct recruitment 'shall be with effect from the 28th May, 1996 (G.O.Ms.No.237, General Administration (Services-D) Department, dated 28.05.1996).

2. In the Government order second read above, orders were issued implementing the Revised Pay Scales of 1999 as recommended by Pay Revision Commission, 1999. The Pay Revision Commission, 1999 have also recommended increase of conveyance allowance.

3. The Government have accepted the recommendation of the Pay Revision Commission, 1999 and accordingly hereby order:

- (i) that the existing rate of conveyance allowance which is subject to maintenance of any other vehicle like cycle be raised to Rs.75/- (Rupees, Seventy Five only) per month.
- (ii) that the existing rate of conveyance allowance which is subject to maintenance of motor car or a motor cycle or a scooter or a moped or any other petrol/diesel driven vehicle be increased by 50% subject to a maximum allowance of Rs.500/- per month .
- (iii) This enhancement is applicable to employees who are in receipt of the above allowance Conveyance allowance for Physically Handicapped

4. The Pay Revision Commission, 1999 has also recommended enhancement of maximum limit of conveyance allowance prescribed for Physically Handicapped i.e.10% of basic pay subject to a maximum of Rs.300/- per month.

5. The Government have hereby order that the conveyance allowance to physically handicapped shall be paid at the rate of 10% of basic pay subject to a maximum of Rs.300/- per month; All other conditions regarding eligibility procedure etc., shall remain unchanged.

6. These orders shall come into force with effect from 01.04.1999 and the arrears from 01.04.1999 to 30.06.1999 shall be credited to General Provident Fund Account of the employee. The enhanced rates shall be paid in cash with effect from 01.07.1999.

7. Necessary amendments to the Andhra Pradesh Manual of Special Pays and Allowances shall be issued in due course.

ORDER:

The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 Central Act 1 of 1996 came into force from 7.2.96. After the, enactment 'of this act it has become necessary that the provisions contained therein relating to filling up of the posts meant for Persons with Disabilities, shall be implemented in right earnest. According to Section 33. of the aforesaid Act "every appropriate Government shall appoint in every establishment such percentage of vacancies not less than 3% (three per cent) of persons or Class of persons with disability of which one percent each shall be reserved for persons suffering from:-

- blindness or low vision;
- hearing impairment;
- locomotor disability or cerebral palsy in the posts identified for each disability.

In case, the appropriate Government having regard to the type of work carried on in any department or establishment, by notification subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in such notification exempt any establishment from the provisions of this, section.

In the reference second read above, the Chief Commissioner for Disabilities has brought to the notice of the Government that several persons who are disabled submitted complaint against the Government, Public Sector Undertakings and autonomous bodies for not implementing the rule of reservation in appointment upto 3% in respect of the Persons with Disabilities as stipulated in the aforesaid provision of law. He has therefore, requested to issue necessary instructions making it mandatory for all the department to follow the rule of reservation to the disabled persons and to furnish a certificate, while sending requisitions to the recruiting agencies in the State, to the effect that as per the provisions of, the said Act relating 3% reservation for persons with disabilities have been followed scrupulously.

In the circumstances stated by the, Chief Commissioner for Disabilities and in order, to ensure strict implementation of the Section 33, of the said Act, the Government hereby direct that all the departments of the Government shall furnish a Certificate while sending requisitions to the A.P.Public Service Commission, A.P.College Service Commission, District Selection Committee, Employment exchanges etc. that the provisions relating to the 3% reservation towards Persons with disabilities have been strictly followed. If they failed to furnish such information to implement 3% reservation for the appointment of the disabled persons, ,the recruiting agencies shall not accept the proposals from the departments (in the absence of 3% reservation implementation certificates for the disabled).

All the Departments of Secretariat are therefore requested to bring these Instructions to the notice of all the appointing authorities for strict compliance.

The Secretary, Visually Handicapped Employee Welfare Association, Kakinada has requested to exempt the visually disabled employees from passing the departmental tests irrespective whether they have crossed 45 years of age or not, as a special case, if they fulfill the other conditions for promotion to next higher posts. In the reference 2nd read above, it is reported that due to non-availability of books and codes in Braille Script, the visually impaired employees are losing chances for higher promotions.

2. After careful examination, it is decided to allow 5 (five) years time to acquire qualification of Tests prescribed under the rules by the Visually Handicapped employees who are otherwise qualified for promotion and during this time the books and codes will be prepared and made available in Braille Script instead of totally exempting them from passing Departmental Tests. However, the employees who come up for consideration for promotion shall be promoted to higher categories during this period of 5 (five) years and such employees shall be directed to pass the tests in the promoted post. The preparation of books and codes in Braille Script for passing of tests shall be reviewed after 5 years.

3. Accordingly, the following notification will be published in the Andhra Pradesh Gazettee.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India and of all other powers hereunto enabling, the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following Adhoc-rule, namely : -

3. In the Government Order fourth read above, based on the recommendations of the Ninth Pay Revision Commission, orders were issued for implementing the Revised Pay Scales, 2010 to the State Government Employees.

4. The Ninth Pay Revision Commission, reviewed the payment of Conveyance Allowance and recommended to discontinued to pay the Conveyance Allowance to the categories and recommended for enhancement in monthly rates for the remaining. categories. The Government have accepted the recommendations of 9th Pay Revision Commission and hereby orders to discontinue the payment of monthly Conveyance Allowance to the categories of posts included in the Annexure to this G.O.

In respect of other categories the following orders are issued .

- (i) the existing rate of Conveyance Allowance which is subject to maintenance of Motor Car or a Motor-cycle be increased by 20% rounded off to the nearest ten rupees subject to a maximum of Rs.850/- per month.
- (ii) that the existing rate of conveyance allowance which is subject to maintenance of Bicycle be raised to Rs.200/- (Rupees two hundred only) per month uniformly.
- (iii) This enhancement is applicable to the holders of the posts for which Conveyance Allowance is admissible as per Annexure-III of Manual of Special Pay and Allowances after excluding the posts specified in the Annexure enclosed to this G.O.

Conveyance Allowance for Physically Handicapped:

5. The Pay Revision Commission, 2010 also recommended enhancement of maximum limit of conveyance allowance prescribed for blind and Physically handicapped i.e. 10% of basic pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 900/- per month.

6. The Government also hereby order that the Conveyance Allowance to the blind and Physically Handicapped employees shall be paid .at 10% of basic pay subject to a maximum of Rs.900/- per month. All other conditions regarding eligibility, procedure etc., shall remain unchanged.

onwards.

Orders have been issued in the Government orders first and third read above reserving 15% and 6% of the shops and stalls constructed by the Municipalities to be leased out to the members of Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes on payment of market rates or rent paid by the neighboring shops without the normal channel of public auction under the provision of rule 12(1)(h) of the Andhra Pradesh municipalities (Regulation of Receipts and Expenditure) Rules, 1968.

2. In the Government orders second and third read above orders have also been issued that the rent of the shop rooms allotted to the members of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes be fixed at Rs.2.50(Rupees two and fifty paise only); per square feet or 50% of the rent paid by the neighbour shops rooms whichever is less.

3 The Secretary, Ananthapur District Orthopaedically Vikalangula Sangham has requested for allotment of 4 shops in Ananthapur Municipality in favour of physically handicapped persons. He further stated that, in spite of several representations, no shop has been allotted to them in Ananthapur municipality.

4 The commissioner and Director of Municipal Administration, Hyderabad in the reference fifth read above requested the Government to consider reservation of 3% of the shop rooms constructed by the municipalities in favour of the members of physically Handicapped on the same analogy of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled tribes dispensing with public auction and issue necessary orders pending amendment to rule 12(1)(h) of the Andhra Pradesh municipalities (Regulation of Receipts and Expenditure) Rules,1963 and also to order for fixation of rent to those shop rooms on par with the shop rooms allotted to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

5 The Government after careful consideration of above proposals, have decided to reserve 3% of shops and stalls constructed by the Municipalities to be leased out to the members of physically handicapped on payment of Rs.2.50 per square feet. OR 50% of the amount paid by the neighbouring shop rooms whichever less without the normal channel of public auction under the provisions of rule 12(1)(h) of the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities (Regulation of Receipts and Expenditure) Rules,1968 pending amendment to the said rule and subject to condition that no further reservation can be given to any other category.

6 The Commissioners of all municipalities are requested to take action accordingly.

7 The Commissioner and Director of Municipal Administration is requested to send necessary proposals for

amending the Rule 12(1)(h) of the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities (Regulation of Receipts and Expenditure) Rules, 1968 immediately.

ORDER

1. In the memo 1st read above, orders were issued that henceforth all the fair price shop vacancies shall be allotted only to unemployed women candidates and that reservations already prescribed for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and physically handicapped shall continue. In the G.O.s. 2nd to 4th read above, orders were issued that fair price shops are being allotted to DW CRA groups. Women's Voluntary Consumer Organization, Thrift groups like Podupu Lakshmi and women Co-operative Societies.

2. In a batch of writ petitions the validity of the policy of allocating all fair price shop vacancies only to women and women's organizations was challenged in the High Court of Andhra Pradesh. The Hon'ble High Court in its Judgment 6th read above held that the policy of allotting all fair price shop vacancies to women is discriminatory and passed orders laying down the following guidelines:

- (i) That women reservation in the matter of allotment of fair price shops shall be fixed at 30%
- (ii) That while making the women reservations as specified above, the Government has to follow the other reservations already in vogue;
- (iii) That the fair price shop dealers selected from women quota shall have to be exhausted both in the reserved category and also open category:
- (iv) That the Government, while making reservation both for women and other categories, shall ensure that reservations should not exceed 50% of the fair price shops:
- (v) That the Government shall issue instructions in accordance with the above directions, to all the appointing authorities for fair price shop dealers and
- (vi) That each Revenue Division/Circle shall be taken as a unit.

Against the said judgment of the Hon'ble High Court appeals were filed in the Hon'ble Supreme Court. The Hon'ble Supreme Court by an order dtd.1.5.98 in SLP No.7448/7479/98 and batch dismissed the special leave petitions holding that the ultimate directions issued in the matters by the Hon'ble High Court appear to be quite fair and equitable and that no inference or the Apex Court was calling for. The Review petitions filed by the State Government also have been dismissed by the Hon'ble supreme Court on 14.10.98.

In view of the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the direction issued by the Divisions Bench of the High Court is final and binding. Therefore all the District Collectors in the State and the Chief Rationing Officer, Hyderabad are requested to see that the orders of the Hon'ble High Court are Scrupulously implemented on the Appointing Authorities in respect of fair price shop dealers as indicated below;

- (i) Allotment of fair price shops to women shall be restricted to 30% taking each Revenue Division/ Circle (in cities) as a unit. Until the 30% reservation prescribed for women is achieved notifications may be issued calling for applications only from women and women's Organizations duly indicating that the percentage of shops held by women is less than the 30% prescribed by the Hon'ble High Court. In those Revenue Divisions or Circles in Cities, where the percentage of shops held by women exceeds 30%, the vacancies may be filled in by men candidates.
- (ii) The 30% reservation to women has to be acquiesced cutting across the other reservations as also open category, the persons selected against women quota shall be placed to the appropriate category.
- (iii) It should be ensured that the fair price shop dealer's, selected from women quota are adjusted both in the reserved category and also open category.
- (iv) The reservations in vogue are less than 50% as indicated below;

- (v) The reservations for women shall be computed taking women in all the categories, taking the Revenue Divisions or Circle (In cities of Hyderabad, Visakhapatnam and Vijayawada) as a unit. At the time of calling for applications, the category to which the vacancy is earmarked shall be indicated in the notification so that the reservations prescribed could be achieved and only after achieving the reservations the shops may be notified for non-reserved categories.
- (vi) As the Hon'ble High Court had set aside all the notifications issued pursuant to Govt. Memo No. 15361/CS.IV/93-1, F & CS Dept.dtd.13.4.93. It is now incumbent on the part of the appointing authorities to take immediate action against all those cases or appointments that were same as per the instructions issued in the reference 1st read above in accordance with the direction of the Hon'ble High Court. All the cases of appeals /revisions (relating to appointments made in pursuance of the reference 1st read above) pending before the authorities viz Joint Collectors, Collectors and Chief Rationing Officer, Hyderabad shall be transferred to the concerned Revenue Divisional officer and District Supply Officer (appointing authority), as the case may be. The appointing authorities (Revenue Divisional Officers/District Supply Officers) shall review all such cases relating to appointments as per the reference 1st read above and initiate action as per the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Commodities (Regulation of Distribution by Card System) Order, 1973.

The orders issued in the reference 1st read above are modified as indicated above and the following amendments are hereby made to the guidelines issued for selection and appointment etc. of fair price shop dealers issued in G.O.Ms.No.198, F, CS & CA (CS.IV) Dept, dated the 6th February, 1996.

AMENDMENTS

In the said orders, in the Annexure, in the guidelines:-

- (1) In para 1.8, after the word "physically Handicapped" the word "women" shall be inserted.
- (2) In para 3, for the words "or her relationship" the words "or his or her relationship" shall be substituted.
- (3) In para 4, for the words "only unemployed women", the words "only unemployed persons" shall be substituted.
- (4) After para 7.1, the following shall be added:
 - 7.2 (i) Reservation to women in the matter of allotment of fair price shops shall be fixed at 30%
 - (ii) The other reservations specified in para 7.1, which are already in vogue shall continue.
 - (iii) The fair price shop dealers selected from women quota shall be adjusted both in the reserved category and also open category.
- (5) Existing para "7.2" shall be renumbered as para "7.3".
- (6) In para 9 (ii), the word "women" shall be omitted.

- (7) In para 10.1, for the words " shall not be eligible" the words" irrespective of the reservation shall not be eligible" shall be substituted.
- (8) In para 10.3 the word "her" shall be omitted.
- (9) In para 10.11, the words " by herself" occurring at the end of the para shall be omitted.
- (10) For para 10.12, the following shall be substituted. " The applicant should personally run the fair price shop and not run it benami or through an agent. However, lady dealers may take the assistance of their family member(s) whose name or names are included in the dealer's supply card. If a women dealer gets married, she must relinquish the dealership when she leaves the village where she was appointed as fair price shop dealer.
- (11) In para 10.13, for the words "if the tries to transfer" the words "if he or she tries to transfer" shall be substituted.

All the District Collectors/Chief Rationing Officer, Hyderabad are requested to issue suitable instructions to the Joint Collectors, Revenue Divisional Officers/Sub- Collectors and District Supply Officers of Hyderabad and Vishakapatnam Cities in this regard.

Pensions - Old Age Pensions, Widow Pensions, Disabled Pensions and Weavers pensions - Common operational guidelines for implementation of the Pension Schemes in the Urban areas of the State- Orders-Issued.

ORDER

1. As part of its welfare programmes, the Government of Andhra Pradesh is implementing various pension schemes for the most needy and vulnerable people i.e. the persons in old age, widows, People with disabilities and weavers to provide them some succor. Realizing the need to universalize the pensions, the Government has decided to take up one - third of wards in the Municipalities for saturation each year in a period of three years under "INDIRAMMA" programme starting from 2006-07.

2 All these pensions till now are handled by different departments following different procedures, old Age pensions and weavers pensions are handled by the Rural Development Department, widow Pensions by social Welfare Department and Disabled Pensions by Women Development, Child Welfare and Disabled Welfare Department.

3 In Order to bring in uniformity in the process and to ensure payment of all types of Pensions on a single day every month, the Government has decided to bring all the pensions under the single umbrella of Rural Development department. The Department of Rural Development will be the nodal agency at the State Level with effect from 01.04.2006 for drawing and disbursing the above Pensions.

4 The Government, after careful consideration of the matter, hereby issues the following operational guidelines for implementation of all the Pension Schemes in the urban areas of the State through the Department of Rural Development.

4.1 Types of Pensions covered

- a Old Age pension
- b Weavers Pension
- c Widow Pension
- d Disabled Pension

4.2 Eligibility criteria

a Eligibility criteria common to all Pensions

- I The proposed beneficiary shall be from BPL family.
- ii He/She shall be a local resident of the district
- iii He/She are not covered under any other Pension Scheme.

b. Old Age Pension

Old age persons, both male and female, who are 65 years of age or above and are destitute(with little or no means of subsistence and no family or relative to depend upon)

c. Weavers Pension

Weavers is 50 years of age or above and destitute.

d. Widow Pension

Widows irrespective of age limit

e. Disabled Pension

Disabled persons having a minimum of 40% disability and are above 18 years of age.

4.3 *Pension Amount*

The scale of benefit under each pension will be notified by the Government shortly.

4.4 *Sanctioning Authority*

The Municipal Commissioner is the sanctioning authority in respect of all pensions, in favour of eligible persons recommended by the Municipal Ward Sabha.

4.5 *Sanction Procedure for New Pensions*

Government will make district-wise allocation of new pensions to be sanctioned under INDIRAMM program. The District Collector shall allocate Municipality -wise pensions based on eligible pensioners identified in Ward Sabhas. The Municipal Commissioner shall make Ward-wise allocation based on the eligible pensioners identified in the Ward Sabhas. The procedure is given in detail below:

- a The Ward Sabha resolution recommending the pensions to the eligible persons shall sent by all bill collector to the Municipal Commissioner.
- b Municipality shall maintain a separate Register for each ward, on pensions with Part-A of the Register containing list of the all the persons who are receiving pensions and Part-B containing list of eligible person identified in the Ward Sabha who have not been sanctioned pensions.
- c The Register will be sent to the Municipal Commissioner along with the Resolution.
- d The Municipal Commissioner scrutinizes the eligibility of the persons recommended by the Ward Sabha and draws up the list of new pensioners keeping in view the number allotted to each Municipality.
- e The sanction proceeding in the Format given in Annexure-I will be given by the Municipal Commissioner.
- f A copy of the sanction proceedings will be dispatched to the Project Director, DRDA for maintaining the data-base. Another copy of the proceedings shall be handed over to the pensioners in the Municipality.
- g The names of the persons sanctioned pensions shall be rounded off in the Part B of the register and shall be added to Part A of the register with the proceedings number. The entries made in the Part A should be duly authenticated with the seal of the Municipal Commissioner at the end of the list. The register along with copies of the sanction proceedings shall be returned to the Ward.

4.6 *Sanction procedure for filling up death vacancies*

Whenever a pensioner dies, the Municipality should select the most deserving person from out of the eligible list of persons who are not yet sanctioned pensions (Part B) so that the new pensioners receives pension from the next month onwards. The procedure to be followed is detailed below.

- a The selection of pensioners from among the eligible persons, should be done as per the order of priority mentioned above.
- b The Municipal Commissioner after satisfying herself/himself about the veracity of the selection, shall issue sanction orders within 10 days of receipt of the resolution which will be issued to the pensioners through the bill collectors, with copies to the Project Director, DRDA and chairperson of the Municipality/ Corporation. On receipt of the sanction orders from the Municipal Commissioner, entries should be made by the bill collector in the Pension Register.
- c The sanctioning authority shall have the right to stop/ recover payments of any pensions sanctioned on the basis of faulty or mistaken information about eligibility.
- d Entire selection process till payment of pensions should be completed within 30days. Disciplinary action will be taken against the Municipal Commissioner, in case of any delay.
- e The data from urban areas will also be part of the centralized data-base being maintained by Project Director, DRDA.

4.7 *Disbursement of Pensions*

Government in panchayat Raj & Rural Development Department will issue budget release orders and administrative sanctions for every quarter for implementation of the Scheme. The Commissioner Rural

Development will disburse the funds to the DRDA s on quarterly basis.

- a By 20th of every month PD DRDA shall take computer print out containing the details of the pensions to be disbursed on the 1st of next month. This list is called Pensions Acquittance List. The PD DRDA shall send the lists together with the fund required for each Municipality to the Municipal Commissioners, by way of cheque.
- b The Municipal Commissioner will hand over the Pensions Acquittance Lit relating to each ward to the concerned Bill Collector and Issue cheques in the name of the Bill Collector by 25th of every month.
- c The Bill Collector shall disburse Pensions directly to the pensioners in the Ward in the presence of Ward members, and the office bearers of DWCUA, on 1st of every month.
- d If the pensioners has not turned up at the time of disbursal, due to any reason, the Bill Collector shall take the help of the DWCUA members and arrange to door deliver pensions.
- e The Bill Collector shall furnish Pensions Acquittance list with signatures or thumb impressions of the pensioners, countersigned by Ward member, within a week to the Municipal Commissioner. The Municipal Commissioner in turn will furnish the same to the DRDA by 12th of every month.
- f The Bill Collector shall also provide to the Municipal Commissioner a list of death vacancies and the substitutes proposed by the Ward Sabha.

4.8 *Role & Responsibility of various Functionaries*

a Commissioner, Rural Development

The Commissioner, RD is responsible for release of funds to the District Collectors based on the allocation made by the State Government.

b Chief Executive Officer, Society for Elimination of Rural Poverty

- i. The CEO, SERP closely monitors the pension scheme and submits monthly reports to the Government on the funds utilized and district wise no of pensions disbursed.
- ii. He is responsible to submit utilization certificates for the amounts disbursed on quarterly basis to the Government.
- iii. He is also responsible to maintain the Welfare Pensions Website which shall be updated by 15th of every month.
- iv. The CEO will commission evaluation studies once a year and submit comprehensive report to the Government on the implementation of the Pension scheme.

c. Project Director, District Rural Development Agency

- i. Will administer the pension scheme in the district in such a way that the pensioners should receive pensions on first of every month without fail.
- ii. Release funds to the Municipalities and conducts quarterly review with them
- iii. Maintains a central database using the software provided and updates the Welfare Pensions Scheme Website on monthly basis.
- iv. Maintains accounts and gets them audited.
- v. Sends monthly report to the CEO, SERP.

d. Municipal Commissioner

- i. Sanctioning authority for pensions in urban areas.
- ii. Releases funds to the bill collectors and reviews with them on the implementation of the pensions.
- iii. Reports to the Municipal Council about the implementation of the scheme.
- iv. Monitoring and follow up of delays, if any, in disbursement and sanction of new cases.
- v. Sends utilization certificate, acquittance and monthly report to the DRDA by 12th of every month.
- vi. Sends monthly report to the Municipal Commissioner.

vii. Returns undisbursed amounts to the Municipal Commissioner by the month end.

4.9 Accounts

- a. DRDA shall maintain separate accounts for each type of Pension at the district level.
- b. The Municipal Commissioner shall furnish UC to the Project Director, DRDA by 12th of every month.
- c. The accounts shall be audited every year at Municipality level and audit reports along with UCs should be furnished to the Project Director, DRDA.
- d. The accounts at the DRDA level shall be audited every year and pension wise audit reports, utilization Certificates should be furnished by the Project Director DRDA to the CEO, SERP every year.
- e. The PD, DRDA shall furnish annual accounts in respects of all Pensions to the Accountant General Office, Hyderabad every year marking a copy to the CEO, SERP.

4.10 Registers

- a. Pensions Registers consists of four sections, each section for each type of pension. Each section will have two parts, part A and B. Part A will contain names of all existing pensioners and Part B will consists of list of eligible persons identified in the Gram Sabha who have not been sanctioned pensions.
- b. Project Director, DRDA shall maintain pension wise master register/database for all pensions separately.
- c. Pensions Register shall be maintained by the Municipal Commissioner ward-wise. The Municipal Commissioner will enter the disbursements, death, new sanctions etc from time to time and shall update the register once in a month.
- d. Project Director, DRDA shall maintain pension wise master register/data-base for all pensions separately.

4.11 Reports

- a. Monthly report in the format prescribed should be furnished by the Municipal Commissioner to the DRDA by 10th of every month in respect of disbursement, new sanctions, death cases, stoppage cases, changed residence cases etc.
- b. The centralized database of DRDA Shall be updated once a month based on the above- mentioned reports.

4.12 Software

Project Director, DRDA shall manage the pensions through the software that is already developed by the Department of RD and host the pension data in the website that is exclusively being designed, on a monthly basis.

4.13. Monitoring & Evaluation

- a. The DRDA shall maintain the database of pensions in the Software provided.
 - b. The DRDA shall hold quarterly meeting for monitoring the programme and for related matters with the Municipal Commissioners and shall furnish quarterly reports to the CEO, SERP and Commissioner, RD.
 - c. DRDA shall send online monthly report to the CEO, SERP by 15th of every month.

ORDER

1. As part of its welfare programmes, the Government of Andhra Pradesh is implementing various pension Schemes for the most needy and vulnerable people i.e. the persons in ole age, widows, people with disabilities and weavers to provide them some succor. Realizing the need to universalize the pensions, the Government has decided to take up one-third of villages for saturation each year in a period of three years under. INDIRAMMA programme starting from 2006-07.

2. All these pensions till now are handled by different departments following different procedures. Old Age pensions and Weavers pensions are handled by the Rural Development Department, Widow Pensions by Social welfare Department and Disabled Pensions by Women Development, Child Welfare and Disabled Welfare Department.

3. In order to bring in uniformity in the process and to ensure payment of all types of pensions on a single day every month, the Government has decided to bring all the pensions under the single umbrella of Rural Development Department. The Department of Rural Development will be the nodal agency at the State Level with effect from 01.04.2006 for drawing and disbursing the above Pensions.

4. The field functionaries of Departments such as Rural Development, Handlooms and Textile, Social Welfare, Women, Development, Child Welfare and Disabled Welfare Department will continue to assist the Gram Panchayats in identifying the eligible persons for receiving the pensions, as per the eligibility criteria specific to each type of pension.

5. The Government after careful consideration of the matter, hereby issues the following operational guidelines for implementation of all Pension Schemes in the rural areas of the State through the Department of Rural Development.

5.1 Types of Pensions covered.

- a. Old Age Pension
- b. Weavers Pension
- c. Widow Pension
- d. Disabled Pension

5.2 Eligibility Criteria

a. Eligibility criteria common to all Pensions.

- i. The proposed beneficiary shall be from BPL family.
- ii. He/She shall be a local resident of the district.
- iii. He/She are not covered under any other Pension Scheme.

b. Old Age Pension.

Old age persons, both male and female, who are 65 years of age or above and are destitute (with little or no means of subsistence and no family or relative to depend upon)

c. Weavers Pension

Weaver is 50 years of age or above and destitute.

d. Widow Pension

Widows irrespective of age limit.

e. *Disabled Pensions*

Disabled persons having a minimum of 40% disability and are above 18 years of age.

5.3 *Pension Amount*

The scale of benefit under each pension will be notified by the Government shortly.

5.4. *Sanctioning Authority*

The MPDO is the sanctioning authority for all pensions, in favour of eligible persons recommended by the Gram Sabha.

5.5. *Sanction Procedure for New Pensions*

Government will make district- wise allocation of new pensions to be sanctioned under INDIRAMMA programme. The District Collector shall allocate Mandal- wise pensions based on eligible pensioners identified in gram Sabhas. The MPDO shall make Panchayat-wise allocation based on the eligible pensioners identified in the Gram Sabhas. The procedure is given in detail below:

- a. The Gram Sabha resolution recommending the pensions to the eligible persons shall be sent by the Panchayat Secretary to the MPDO.
- b. Gram Panchayat shall maintain a separate Register on pensions. Part -A of the Register contains list of all the persons who are receiving pensions and Part- B contains list of eligible persons identified in the Gram Sabha who have not been sanctioned pensions.
- c. The Register will be sent to the MPDO along with the GP resolution.
- d. The MPDO scrutinizes the eligibility of the persons recommended by the Gram Sabha and draws up the list of new pensioners keeping in view the number allotted to each panchayat.
- e. The sanction proceedings will be given by the MPDO in the format given in Annexure-1.
- f. Copies of the sanction proceedings will be sent to the PD, DRDA and also to the pensioners in the village. A Copy of the same shall also be sent to the Village Organization for securing greater transparency.
- g. The names of the persons who are sanctioned pensions shall be rounded off in the Part B of the register and shall be added to Part A of the register with the proceedings number. The entries made in the Part A should be duly authenticated with the seal of the MPDO at the end of the list. The register along with copies of the sanction proceedings shall be returned to the GP.

5.6. *Sanction procedure for filling death vacancies.*

Whenever a pensioner dies, the GP in consultation the VO should select the most deserving person from the Part-B of the Register so that the new pensioner receives pension from the next month onwards. The procedure to be followed is detailed below.

- a. The criteria for selection shall be as detailed below.
 - i. In the case of old-age pensions, old widows shall be given first preference.
 - ii. The person who is older (both male or female) shall be given preference over the rest in the case of old age pensions.
 - iii. Person with a higher degree of disability shall be given preference in the case of disability pensions.
- b. The MPDO after satisfying herself/himself with the selection, shall issue sanction orders within 10 days of receipt of the resolution which are handed over to the pensioners through the Panchayat Secretary, with copies to the Project Director, DRDA, the Gram Panchayat and the VO.
- c. The name of the newly sanctioned pensioners will be entered in the Part A and shall be deleted from the Part B of the Register.
- d. The sanctioning authority shall have the right to stop/recover payments of any pension sanctioned on the basis of faulty or mistaken information about eligibility.
- e. Entire selection process till payment of pension should be completed within 30 days.

5.7 *Disbursement of Pensions.*

Government in PR and RD Dept will issue budget release orders and administrative sanctions for every quarter for implementation of the Scheme. The Commissioner, Rural Development will disburse the funds to the DRDA s on quarterly basis.

- a. By 20th of every month, the Project Director, DRDA shall take the computer print out containing the details of the pensions to be disbursed on the 1st of next month. This list is called Pensions Acquittance List. The PD shall send the lists together with the funds require for each Mandal to the MPDOs by way of cheque.
- b. The MPDO will hand over the Pensions Acquittance List relating to each GP to the concerned Panchayat Secretaries and will issue cheques in the name of the Panchayat Secretaries by 25th of every month.
- c. The Panchayat Secretary shall disburse pensions directly to the pensioners in the village in the presence of Sarpanch. GP members and the office bearers of Village Organization on 1st of every month.
- d. If the pensioner has not turned up at the time of disbursal, due to any reason, the Panchayat Secretary shall take the help of the VO and arrange to door deliver the pension through the Village Organization.
- e. The Panchayat Secretary shall furnish Pensions Acquittance List with the signatures or thumb impressions of the Pensioners, countersigned by Sarpanch within a week to the MPDO and MPDO in turn will furnish the same to the DRDA by 12th of every month.
- f. The Panchayat Secretary shall also provide to the MPDO a list of death-vacancies and the substitutes proposed by the GP.

5.8 *Role & Responsibility of various Functionaries*

a. *Commissioner, Rural Development*

The Commissioner, RD is responsible for release of funds to the District Collectors based on the allocation made by the State Government.

b. *Chief Executive Officer, Society for Elimination of Rural poverty.*

- i. The CEO ,SERP closely monitors the pension scheme and submits monthly reports to the Government on the funds utilized and district wise no of pensions disbursed.
- ii. He is responsible to submit utilization certificates for the amounts disbursed on quarterly basis to the Government,
- iii. He is also responsible to maintain the Welfare Pensions Website which shall be updated by 15th of every month.
- iv. The CEO will commission evaluation studies once a year and submit comprehensive report to the Government on the implementation of the Pensions Scheme.

c. *Project Director, District Rural Development Agency*

- i. Will administer the pension scheme in the district in such a way that the pensioners should receive pensions on first of every month without fail.
- ii. Releases funds to the MPDOs and conducts quarterly review with them.
- iii. Maintains a central database using the software provided and updates the Welfare Pension Scheme Website on monthly basis.
- iv. Maintains accounts and gets them audited.
- v. Sends monthly report to the CEO, SERP.
- vi. Puts in place a strategy to strengthen and build the capacities of MS and VO to gradually shift to disbursement of pensions through the CBOs.

d. *Mandal Parishad Development Officer*

- i. Sanctioning authority for pensions in rural areas.
- ii. Releases funds to the Panchayat Secretary. Reviews with the Panchayat Secretaries on the implementation.

- iii. Reports to the Mandal Parishad about the implementation of the scheme.
 - iv. Reviews on monthly basis death vacancies and their filling up with eligible beneficiaries with the Panchayat Secretary.
 - v. Sends utilization certificate, Acquittance and monthly report to the DRDA by 12th of every month.
 - vi. Maintains accounts and gets it audited every year.
 - vii. Redressal of grievances.
- e. *Panchayat secretary*
- i. Shall disburse pensions directly to the pensioners in the village in the presence of Sarpanch and the members of Gram Panchayat on 1st of every month at a public place in every habitation.
 - ii. The Panchayat Secretary shall furnish acquittance countersigned by Sarpanch within a week to the MPDO.
 - iii. The Panchayat Secretary shall also provide to the MPDO a list of death vacancies that have occurred.
 - iv. Shall maintain the pension register and shall update it every month.
 - v. Shall report the death vacancy to the Gram Panchayat within 2 days of the vacancy having occurred.
 - vi. Shall forward the resolution of the Gram Sabha to the MPDO selecting beneficiaries against the new sanction.
 - vii. Sends monthly report to the MPDO.
 - viii. Returns undisbursed amounts to the MPDO by the month end.

5.9 *Accounts*

- a. DRDA shall maintain separate accounts for each type of Pension at the deistrict level.
- b. Panchayat Secretary shall furnish Utilization Certificates to the MPDO by 8th of every month and MPDO in turn shall furnish UC to the Project Director, DRDA by 12th of every month.
- c. The accounts shall be audited every year at MPDO level and audit reports along with UCs should be furnished to the Project Diretdor, DRDA.
- d. The accounts at the DRDA level shall be audited every year and pension wise audit reports. Utilization Certificates should be furnished by the Project Director, DRDA to the CEO, SERP every year.
- e. The PD, DRDA shall furnish annual accounts in respect of all pensions to the Accountant General Office, Hyderabad every year marking a copy to the CEO, SERP.

5.10 *Registers*

- a. Pensions Register consists of four sections, each section for each type of pension. Each section will have two parts, Part A and Part B, Part A will contains of all existing Pensioners and Part B will consist of list of eligible persons identified in the Gram sabha who have not been sanctioned pensions.
- b. Project Director, DRDA shall maintain pension wise master register/database for all pensions separately.
- c. Gram Panchayat and MPDO shall maintain pension registers and will enter the disbursements, death, new sanctions etc from time to time. The Panchayat Secretary shall update the register once in a month.
- d. A copy of the same will be placed with the VO, MS, MPDO and Project Director, DRDA.

5.11 *Reports*

- a. Monthly report in the format prescribed should be furnished by the Panchayat Secretary to the MPDO by 6th of every month and in turn MPDO to the DRDA by 10th of every month in respect of disbursement, new sanctions, death cases, stoppage cases changed residence cases etc.

- b. MPDO shall send the report to the DRDA in respect of newly sanctioned cases on or before 10th of every month.
- c. The Centralized database of DRDA shall be updated once a month based on the above mentioned reports.

5.12 Distribution of Pensions through Mandal Samakhya & Village Organization

Not with standing the procedure contained in para 5.7, wherever the MS have emerged as a self- reliant and self managed institution and have demonstrated the ability to deliver services to the poor more effectively and in a transparent manner, the District Collectors can channelise funds through the MS and VOs and secure disbursement of pensions by the VO in the presence of the Sarpanch and Ward Members. All the guidelines, covering all other aspects of the pensions contained in this GO will have to be followed. Even where disbursement of pensions happens through the VO. Identification of new pensioners to fill up the vacancies shall be done by GP only in consultation with the VO.

5.13 Software

Project Director, DRDA shall manage the pensions through the software that is already developed by the Department of RD and host the pension data in the website that is exclusively being designed. on a monthly basis. He/She shall update the disbursement status, data on filling up of death vacancies, temporary migration etc. in the data base by 15th of every month.

5.14 Monitoring & Evaluation

- a. The DRDA shall maintain the database of pensions in the software provided
 - b. The DRDA shall hold quarterly meeting for monitoring the programme and for related matters with the MPDOs and shall furnish quarterly reports to the CEO, SERP and Commissioner RD.
 - c. DRDA shall send online monthly report to the CEO, SERP by 15th of every month.

3. The benefits like Pensions, Scholarships, Indira Avas Yojana (IAY) Houses, and Economic Support Schemes etc. are independent of each other and confer or provide different nature of support for differently abled.

4. After careful examination of the proposal and in the circumstances reported by the Commissioner, Dept. for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens in the reference read above, Government hereby issue orders for sanction of various benefits like Pensions, Scholarships, IAY Houses, economic Support Scheme etc. to the eligible persons as per eligibility criteria and conditions stipulated for each scheme/benefit, irrespective of the nature of the benefit ,to differently abled persons, provided each of the benefit gives a different nature of support or rehabilitative support to them. However, it shall be ensured that benefits reach deserving eligible persons in an equitable manner and computerized monitoring introduced by Commissioner, Dept. for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens and Managing Director, A.P. Vikalangula Co- Operative Corporation at the earliest.

The Government has decided to form groups for Disabled People as per like Fixed Labour Groups (FLG) and provide such employment of 150 days that fetches a minimum annual wage of Rs.15000/- per annum for each and every individual disabled person in Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme. To accomplish this objective the following specifics must be implemented indispensably.

1. The complete Information of the disabled persons should be recorded in job cards which have already been issued to the respected families and other households, in the past if those job cards are found to be having inadequate of disabled persons.
2. The households of people with disability and individual disabled people should immediately be issued job cards. Single adult people with disability whether they may be (male or female), should be identified as an individual household and issued a job card.
3. Small groups should be formed with people with disability in rural areas so as to provide them with 150 days of employment in a year in such a way that they will be paid a minimum salary of Rs.15000/- per annum. Such kind of work as close to the village, easy accessible selected (accessible) by the person with disability , those works that are reserved for the people with disability should be done by the people with disability only.
4. People with disability Groups should also be registered in the computers like Fixed Labour Groups.
5. Giving 30% less measured work mark done by the normal candidates, note that the disabled people are paid equal wages to that of the normal candidates.
6. The registration of disabled people in job cards and whiles the formation of disabled groups, it should only be done based on mere submission of documents certifying not less than 40%.disability. P.O. or A.P.O. can certify the disability is 40% and register a disabled person if he does not possess the certificate.

Considering all these particulars, make disabled groups and provide each and every person with disability an employment in Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Andhra Pradesh, hereby makes the following amendment to the Andhra Pradesh Revised Pension Rules, 1980.

The amendment hereby made shall be observed to have come into force on the 29th October, 1979.

AMENDMENT

In rule 50 of the said rules, to item (iii) of sub-rule (5) the following shall be added, namely : -

“Provided that if the son or daughter of a Government Servant is suffering from any disorder or disability of mind or is physically crippled or disabled so as to render him or her unable to earn a living even after attaining the age of twenty-one years in the case of the son and twenty-four years in the case of daughter for life subject to the following conditions, namely : -

- (i) If such son or daughter is one among two or more children of the Government Servant, the family pension shall be initially payable to the children in the order set out in clause (iii) of sub-rule (7) of this rule, until the last child attains the age of twenty one or twenty four years as the case may be and thereof the family pension shall be resumed in favour of the son or daughter suffering from disorder or disability of mind or who is physically crippled or disabled and shall be payable to him / her for life :
- (ii) If there are more than one such son or daughter suffering from disorder or disability of mind or who are physically crippled or disabled, the family pension shall be paid in the following order, namely :-
 - (a) firstly to the son and if there are more than one son, the younger of them will get the family pension only after the life time of the elder :
 - (b) secondly to the daughter and if there are more than one daughter, the younger of them will get the family pension only after the life time of the elder :
- (iii) the family pension shall be paid to such son or daughter through the guardian as if he/she or, were a minor :
- (iv) before allowing the family pension for life to any such son or daughter, the sanctioning authority shall satisfy that the handicap is of such a nature as to prevent him or her from earning his or her livelihood the same shall be evidenced by a certificate obtained from a medical officer not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon setting out, as far as possible, the exact mental order/physical condition of the child :
- (v) the person receiving the family pension as guardians of such son or daughter shall produce every three years a certificate from a medical officer not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon to the effect that

he or she continues to suffer from disorder or disability or continued to be physically crippled or disabled.

EXPLANATIONS : -

(a) Only that disability which manifests itself before the retirement or death of the Government servant while in service shall be taken into account for the purpose of grant of family pension under this sub-rules.

(b) A daughter shall become ineligible for family pension under this sub-rule from the date she gets married.

(c) The family pension payable to such a son or daughter shall be stopped if he or she starts earning his/her livelihood.

(d) In such cases it shall be the duty of the guardian to furnish a certificate to the Treasury or Bank, as the case may be, every month that.

(i) he or she has not started earning his/her livelihood.

(ii) in case of a daughter, that she has not yet married.

Government in G.O.Ms.No:89, Social Welfare (CI) Department, dated:19-9-95 1st read above have issued orders for acquisition, of 15,000 acres .of land for distribution of three lakhs house sites to the weaker sections at a cost of Rs.75.00 Crores by the end of 31-3-1996. The above orders were further extended in G.O.Ms.No:79, - Social Welfare (CI) Department, dated: 19-7-96 beyond 31-3-1996 until further orders.

2. Government in G.O.Ms.No.29, Social Welfare (CI) Department, dated: 19-3-96 in the reference 3rd read above have issued orders for enhancing the income limit from Rs.6,000/- per annum to Rs.11,000/- per annum for a beneficiary to 'become eligible for allotment of a house site, free of cost, belonging to weaker sections.

1) Government in G.O.Ms.No: 1181, Revenue (Assignment-I) Department, dated: 25-11-93 in the reference 4th read above have issued orders directing all the District Collectors in the State to provide house sites of 50 Sq., Yards/100 Sq.,Yards within the same district, preferably in the Head Quarters town, to war-widows and disabled ex-servicemen in the State, free of cost.

2) The Government in Social Welfare Department proposed to reserve a fixed percentage of the allotted target of house sites in each district for certain categories, as mentioned hereunder within the caste-wise ratios fixed in the G.O. first read above for distribution of house sites in the acquired lands.

- i) For the Orphan girls above 16 years of age, 1% of house sites out of the target allotted to the districts, was proposed to be reserved for distribution of house sites to them, without insisting on any income criteria.
- ii) Proposed to reserve 3% of the house sites out of the total target of the district for allotment of house sites to physically handicapped persons but only to those who have income less than Rs. 11,000/- per annum as per G.O.Ms.No.29, Social Welfare (C) Department, dated: 19-3-96.
- iii) Similarly, it was proposed that for the widows, who do not own land and other properties etc., and are destitute, 1% of the house sites out of the total target allotted to the district may be reserved.

3) Therefore the Government hereby issue the following orders:-

The quota fixed for each caste group for each of the three categories mentioned 'above would be in accordance with the orders issued in G.O.Ms.No.89, Social Welfare (CI) Department, dated:19-9-95 i.e., for example if a district has a target of 10,000 house sites, 1% of 10,000 i.e 100 house sites would be allotted in each district for Orphan girls, above 16 years of age (without any income criteria) in the following orders:-

2. Lr. No. 1/10-99-P&PW(E), dated 10.02.2000 of Govt. of India, Department of Pension and Pensioners Welfare.

According to Rule 50 of A.P. Revised Pension Rules, 1980 (as amended vide G.O. Ms. No.52, Finance & Planning (F.W-Pen. I) Department, dated 20.02.1984), Family Pension is allowed to sons/daughters of a Government Servant who are suffering from any disorder or disability of mind or is physically crippled or disabled, subject to the conditions mentioned therein.

2. It is also specified there under the said rule, that before allowing the family pension for life to any such son/daughter, the Sanctioning Authority shall satisfy that the handicap is of such a nature so as to prevent him/her from earning livelihood and the same shall be evidenced by a Certificate obtained from a Medical Officer not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon setting out as far as possible, the exact mental or physical condition of the child so as to render him or her unable to earn a living.

3. The Accountant General, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad in the letter 1st referred above, stated that if physically handicapped/disabled person can get employment, it is not clear as to how the Sanctioning Authority could come to such a conclusion about non-earning of livelihood and sanctioning Family Pension under the above said rule. The matter has been referred to the Government of India who made this rule first and they stated in the reference 2nd cited that the Family Pension for life to such handicapped child is admissible if such child is unable to earn the livelihood on account of that handicap and this fact should be evidenced through a Medical Certificate of atleast from a Civil Surgeon.

4. According to explanation (c) under sub-rule 5 of Rule 50 of Revised Pension Rules, 1980 the family pension payable to such a son or daughter shall be stopped if he or she starts earning his/her livelihood. Further as per explanation (d) of the said Rule, in such cases it shall be the duty of the guardian to furnish a Certificate to the Treasury or Banks as the case may be every month that:

- (i) he or she has not started earning his/her livelihood
- (ii) In case of a daughter, that she has not yet married.

Further as per condition (v) of the above said Rule, the person receiving the family pension as guardian of such son or daughter shall produce every three years a Certificate from a Medical Officer not below the rank of Civil Surgeon to the effect that he or she continue to suffer from disorder or disability of mind or continues to be physically crippled or disabled .

5. As such, it is clearly stipulated necessary conditions in the rules to safe guard the sanction of family pension to the handicapped children and to pay it to the genuine persons and to watch its payment.

6. Therefore, all the Pension Sanctioning Authorities are directed to strictly follow the relevant rules in sanctioning Family Pension to the handicapped children's of the Government employees. The existing stipulation in regard to Guardianship Certificates/appointment of guardians will continue to apply in respect of the physically crippled/disabled children who are minors and the children suffering from any disorder or disability of mind as they are covered by the existing laws for the purpose of obtaining Guardianship Certificates/appointment of guardians by the Courts.

7. All the Pension Disbursing Authorities (S.T.Os/P.P.Os) are directed to watch the submission of necessary Certificates as stipulated in the above said Rule for payment of Family Pension to the handicapped children by making necessary entries in the Pension Payment Order.

8. Government also orders that the Pension Sanctioning Authorities and Pension Disbursing Authorities, who violated the condition prescribed for sanction/payment of Family Pension to physically handicapped will be viewed seriously and payment made due to their negligence will be liable for recovery from the Officers concerned/ Guardian.

Section 44, 45 and 46 of the Act stipulate that the appropriate Governments, the local authorities and establishments in the transport sector shall, within the limits of their economic capacity and development, take special measures to provide barrier free facilities for persons with disabilities in public places, roads and transport. The Government of India has therefore requested the State Governments to ensure provision of barrier free facilities in all new Government buildings and public utilities.

2. Government after careful examination, hereby direct that all the Government departments, local authorities and the agencies shall provide barrier free environment in all new buildings and public utilities for easy access of the persons with disabilities with immediate effect. The required funds will have to be provided by the concerned departments from their own allocations.

3. All the departments of Secretariat, all the Heads of Departments and all the District Collectors in the State are, therefore, ordered to take necessary action accordingly.

4. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide their C.O.No.2635/PFS/02, dt:23.05.2002.

ORDER :

In the letter first read above the Special Chief Secretary, Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department has informed that the Andhra Pradesh Rural Poverty Reduction Programme (VELUGU Phase II) has included a sub component for the disabled sector with the long term objective of helping disabled persons and their caregivers to improve their livelihood opportunities and quality of life. The programme will cover disabled persons in 500 mandals during the project period of six years. Recognizing that the disabled persons are often among the poorest and the most marginalized of the poor, the APRPRP will focus on empowerment of the disabled within the communities and creation of awareness of rights and entitlements under of the PWD Act, and community interventions including community based rehabilitation.

2. This programme which envisages survey, conduct of camps, constitution of Medical board, issuance of ID and community based rehabilitation requires convergence with various departments. In order to evolve a strategy for convergence the department for Disabled Welfare in collaboration with the SERP and National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped has organized a workshop on 3.10.2002 at NIMH involving the concerned departments viz., Medical & Health, Education, officials of the Disabled Welfare Department, National Institutes (NIMH, NIVH & AYJNIHH), Disabled Activists and the NGOS working in the field of Disabled Welfare.

3. On the basis of the deliberations in the workshop, the following orders are issued for implementation of the Disabled Welfare sub Project under VELUGU in terms of the provisions of PWD Act, 1995.

(I) MEDICAL & HEALTH DEPARTMENT

1. To impart training to the Anganwadi workers, ANMs, para medical workers and other functionaries involved in the field of Disabled Welfare for intervention, early detection and identification of disabilities in the newly born child.
2. To sensitize and create awareness among the pregnant women to go for institutional deliveries.
3. To improve health delivery in urban slums for prevention of infant and maternal mortality.
4. To strengthen sub center services for improved health care for women and children.
5. To reduce low birth weight and take up systematic intervention for eradication of polio, measles, neonatal tetanus with appropriate community based activities etc.
6. To develop/replicate communication material and distribution of essential supplies.
7. To ensure that medical officers of all the Primary Health Centres undertake immunization of all women & children for prevention of disabilities.
8. To ensure that District Headquarters Hospitals and District Medical and Health Officers conduct Medical Camp along with the available Specialists in the field of ophthalmology, ENT, Orthopaedic and clinical Psychology.

9. To impart training to the Anganwadi Workers, ANMs working at village level to encourage the pregnant and lactating women, to take vitamin 'A' for reduction of visual deficiencies.
10. To provide mobile medical team for visiting villages, Thandas and slums to detect, prevent and identify the disabilities at the early stages i.e. in the age group of 0-5 years.

(II) Women Development and child Welfare

1. To include the subject of prevention / early identification of disability in the regular job course training for Anganwadi workers.
2. To depute all Anganwadi workers for regular / periodical training in the subject of prevention of disability.
3. To ensure that Anganwadi workers arrange for full and complete immunization of all eligible women and children.
4. To recognize in an appropriate manner the efforts made by Anganwadi workers for early identification of disability.

(III) Education Department

1. To ensure 3% reservation in admissions both in Government and aided schools as per provisions of Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995.
2. To take up printing of text books in Braille script for the use of the visually handicapped school going children by providing budgetary allocations for this purpose and to place the funds at the Commissioner, Disable Welfare to strengthen the Braille Press already established.
3. To mainstream education of disabled children on to the agenda of Education for All.
4. To give specific focus to the education of disabled children as well as adult illiterate disabled under Sarva Siksha Abhiyan.
5. To develop disabilities specific teaching and learning materials such as Braille for Visually impaired, teaching and learning material with sign language for hearing impaired etc.
6. To develop advanced teaching and learning materials for visually impaired and hearing impaired with the help of information technology packages.
7. To maintain and share with Disabled Welfare Department and NGOs the database created by DPEP regarding disabled children.
8. To develop Training module and manuals on special education and integrated education and conduct more training programmes for resource teachers of integrated education as well as normal teachers in the general education.
9. To maintain a separate teacher student ratio for various categories of disabilities.
10. To establish residential facilities at primary, secondary and higher levels for the disabled.
11. To give special focus to the disabled in mid day meal and other schemes introduced by Education Department.
12. To provide through schools assistive devices, aids and appliances, and professionals for frequent assessment, tests and care of the children and other facilities required for assessment, fitment and care of disabled children.

(IV) Panchayat Raj and Municipal Administration

1. Take steps to improve sanitation facilities particularly in the weaker section housing colonies.
2. To provide safe drinking water and reduce the fluorine content to check incidence of disability.
3. Promote barrier free environment in public places by enforcing C.P.W.D. code while approving building plans.
4. All the Departments are requested to issue detailed operational guidelines and take action in a coordinated manner to achieve the desired objective of enabling the disabled persons to improve their livelihood opportunities and quality of life.

5. In order to achieve the necessary convergence at the grassroots level the following Mandal/District level Committees are constituted for monitoring and review.

ORDER:

The Director General, Medical and Health Services and Commissioner, Andhra Pradesh Vaidya Vidhana Parishad in his letter read above has stated that a number of complaints are being received regarding false Medical Certificates issued by certain Medical Officers working in Government Hospitals / Dispensaries. He further stated that a few of such certificates are used for getting benefits under disability programme and to get long leave and transfers. He has suggested to award severe punishments to the Medical Officers who issued false medical certificates for undue advantages.

2. In order to curb the above practice, the Government after careful consideration, hereby order that necessary disciplinary action, under the Andhra Pradesh Civil Service (CCA) Rules, 1991, may be initiated. In cases where such irregularity is established, the disciplinary authority may impose the major penalty of removal from service on;

- a) the Government employees who produce and submit false Medical Certificates for getting benefits under Disability Programme and also utilizing the certificates for the purpose of long leave and transfers, and;
- b) the Medical Officers, who issue incorrect and false Medical Certificate.

3. The disciplinary authorities and also the authorities empowered to impose penalties under the A.P. Civil Services (CCA) Rules, 1991 while dealing with the disciplinary cases relating to false Medical Certificates, shall follow the above orders.

4. The Health Medical and Family Welfare Department may issue guidelines for random verification of the Medical Certificates regularly by the Medical Boards at the District Level and also at the State Level.

5. The Departments of Secretariat, Heads of Departments and District Collectors are requested to bring these orders to the notice of all concerned for compliance.

ORDER

The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare, Hyderabad in the letter 2nd read above, has informed that the Association of Maruguchi (Dwarfs), Hyderabad has submitted a representation to the Hon'ble Chief Minister that Dwarfs should be recognized as Disabled persons for the purpose of availing benefits extended by Government. The C.M's Office forwarded the application to the Commissioner, Disabled Welfare to take action in the matter. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare referred the matter to the Director of Medical Education, Hyderabad to furnish his remarks in this regard. Accordingly, the 'Director of Medical Education instructed the Superintendent, Osmania Hospital to examine the issue and submit his report in the matter. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare further informed (vide letter 4th read above) that the Superintendent, Osmania General Hospital, Hyderabad vide his letter 3rd read above has furnished his report, which reads as follows: -

"As regards Dwarf persons, their inclusion in the category of Orthopaedically handicapped persons is decided by Permanent Disability, and Physical impairment. Permanent disability is described as when a person's actual or presumed ability to engage in gainful activity is reduced or absent because of a medical condition related to anatomical or functional abnormality. The state of being disabled is also defined as absence of competent physical, intellectual and moral power. In view of the above, a Dwarf person can be included as handicapped or disabled because of loss of physical, intellectual and moral power as a result of short, structure and abnormal (stunted) bone and joint growth. As a result of short structure and abnormally retarded bones and joints, the ability of dwarfs to engage in gainful activity is considerably reduced. Hence dwarfs are eligible to be included in the category of Orthopaedically handicapped"

2. Government of India have also defined and issued the following guidelines for evaluation of Permanent Physical Impairment In cases of short stature/dwarfism:

- 1) Recumbent length or longitudinal height, below 3rd percentile or less than 2 Standard Deviation, from the mean is considered as short stature.
- 2) The evaluation of a Short Statured person should be considered only when 'it is of disproportionate variety and is accompanied by underlying pathological conditions e.g. Achondroplasia, Chandrodysplasia Punctata, spondyloepiphysical dysphasia! Mucopoly and acchrydosis, etc.
- 3) The ICMR norms (enclosed as Annexure) should be used as guidelines for height.
- 4) Every 1" vertical height reduction should be valued as 4% permanent physical impairment.

5) Associated skeletal deformities should be evaluated separately and total percentage of both should be added by combining the formula.

3. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare has therefore requested the Government to issue necessary orders as per the guidelines prescribed for issuing disability certificate to Dwarf persons by the Government of India and for inclusion of the category of Dwarf persons in the category of Orthopaedically handicapped (locomotor disability) so that the Chairman of the District Medical Boards which were constituted vide G.O. 1st read above can be addressed to issue Medical Certificates to the Dwarf persons to get Government benefits on par with other categories of the disabled.

4. Dwarfs who are treated as Orthopaedically Handicapped are eligible to get benefits like Bus passes, Rail Concessions, Disabled pensions, Scholarships, marriage Incentive Awards, Fair price shops, Housing, Reservations in Employment, Financial Assistance, etc. as per the orders / rules in force.

5. After careful examination, the Government hereby order that Dwarf persons be included in the category of Orthopaedically Handicapped.

6. The Commissioner, Disabled Welfare is requested to take necessary action in the matter.

Hyderabad.

According to proviso under item No.(iii), (iv) & (v) of sub-rule 5 under Rule 50 of A.P. Revised Pension Rules, 1980 the children of deceased Government employees who are suffering from any disorder or disability of mind or is physically crippled or disabled and unable to earn their livelihood are eligible for family pension for life. The rule position is as follows:

- Proviso to (iii) "If the son or daughter of a Government servant is suffering from any disorder or disability of mind or is physically crippled or disabled so as to render him or her unable to earn a living even after attaining the [the ages of Son/Daughter as specified in clause (ii) and (iii) above] the family pension shall be payable to such son or daughter for life subject to the certain conditions, prescribed under this clause".
- (iv) before allowing the family pension for life to any such son or daughter, the sanctioning authority shall satisfy that the handicap is of such a nature as to prevent him or her from earning his or her livelihood and the same shall be evidenced by a certificate obtained from a medical officer not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon setting out, as far as possible, the exact mental or physical condition of the child;
- (v) the person receiving the family pension as guardian of such son or daughter, shall produce every three years a certificate from a medical officer not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon to the effect that he or she continues/to suffer from disorder or disability of mind or continues to be physically crippled or disabled.

2. It came to the notice of the Government through the reference cited that some of Government Departments are approaching the Accountant General, A.P. Hyderabad for sanction of family pension for life to the children of deceased Government employees as per the provisions of Persons With Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, (Act No.1 of 1996) i.e., for disabilities such as Rheumatoid Arthritis, Schizophrenia, Joint Pains, Dumbness, Deafness, Partially blind and partially crippled.

3. In this connection it is clarified that the said Act i.e., Persons With Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, (Action No.1 of 1996) was not adopted by Government of India for the purpose or sanction of family pension for life to the mentally crippled/ physically handicapped children of deceased Central Government employees. State Government is following the rules and provisions as contained in Central Pension Rules for the purpose of Pensionary benefits to State Government employees.

4. In view of the above, all the Head of Departments including Secretariat Departments are informed that since, Government of India and the State Government have not yet adopted the Persons With Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, (Act 1 of 1996) for the purpose of sanctioning family pension for life to the children of the deceased Government employees, hence all the Pension Sanctioning Authorities in the State should adhere to the rule position as contemplated under proviso. item Nos. (iii), (iv) & (v) of sub-rule 5 under Rule 50 of A.P. Revised Pension Rules, 1980 only.

Desk) Dept., dt. 15.6.1992 order that the above categorization issued by Government of India in Gazette Notification dt. 13.6.2001 in respect of Mentally Retarded persons, be adopted. Accordingly, barring borderline cases, all other categories of Mentally Retarded are eligible for the benefits due to the disabled persons.

5. All other conditions stipulated in the G.O. 1st read above hold good.

In the G.O.3rd read above, Govt., have issued orders treating the Dwarf persons as orthopaedically handicapped persons.

2. In the representation 6th read above, the President, A.P.Maruguchi Disabled People Association have represented that since they have been treated as orthopaedically handicapped persons, they are entitled for Bus Passes on par with orthopaedically handicapped persons and requested the Government to issue necessary Bus Passes.

3. In the references 7th read above, the Commissioner of Disabled Welfare Department has requested the Government to issue Bus passes to the Dwarf persons on par with orthopaedically handicapped persons.

In the letters 5th and 8th read above, the VC&MD, APSRTC has requested the Government to issue necessary directions in the matter and also requested to arrange to provide necessary budget provision so as to enable them to issue bus passes to the Dwarf persons as is being done in the case of orthopaedically handicapped persons so as to prefer claim for 100% reimbursement of expenditure on account of issue of such bus passes to the Dwarf persons. As estimated an amount of Rs.1.69 crores is required for 100% reimbursement of bus pass concession to be given to Dwarf persons on par with orthopaedically handicapped persons.

The Government have examined the above matter in detail. Keeping in view of the decisions taken in the G.O.s 1st and 4th read above and also keeping in view of the recommendation of the Commissioner, Disabled Welfare 7th read above, the Government hereby permit the VC & MD APSRTC for issue of Bus passes to the Dwarf persons in the State on par with orthopaedically handicapped persons.

The WD CW & DW Deptt./ shall make necessary budget provision during 2006-07 and onwards for reimbursement of 100% bus pass concession to APSRTC on account of issue of bus passes to Dwarf persons on par with orthopaedically handicapped persons. The APSRTC are directed to prefer the Bill with WD CW & DW (DW) Deptt./ for 2006-07 and onwards for reimbursement of expenditure on account of issue of passes to Dwarf persons.

Government of India have fixed a target of 15,57,800 families to be covered under Antyodaya Anna Yojana Scheme in three phases duly indicating the eligibility criteria to be followed for selection of beneficiaries and the Government of Andhr Pradesh have issued necessary orders for indentification of beneficiaries under the scheme vide references 1st to 7th read above.

2. In the reference 8th read above, the Director (PD), Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi has informed that according to the information furnished by the Directorate General of Health Services (Central Leprosy Division), as against the number of 5378 Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs) residing in A.P. State, only 2814 LAPs are covered under AAY Scheme.

3. The Director (PD), Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi has stated that in the guidelines issued for AAY, it has been specifically laid down that widow or terminally ill persons or diabled persons with no assured means of subsistence or family / social support would be eligible for coverage under AAY. As per these guidelines Leprosy Affected Persons would be eligible for coverage under the scheme provided they are from identified BPL families and are terminally ill or disabled. However, LAPs who are from non BPL families can not be so considered as per guidelines of the scheme.

4. The Director (PD), Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi, has requested to include all such eligible BPL families of Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs) in the AAY list on priority, against the criteria mentioned in para 2 (b) and (c) of the guidelines for identification of AAY families under Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY), circulated vide D.O. letter No. 6(5)/2005/PD-1, Dtd : 12.05.2005, within respective ceilings on numbers of the AAY families communicated by the GOI.

5. The matter has been examined carefully and it is hereby ordered to include all such eligible BPL families of Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs) in the AAY list on priority, against the criteria mentioned in para II and III of the Annexure-II of the guidelines communicated for identification of AAY families under Antyodaya Anna Yojana, vide G.O. Ms. No. 66, Consumer Affairs, Food & Civil Supplies (CS.I) Dept, Dtd: 15.06.05, within the targets assigned to the respective districts under AAY Scheme.

6. Therefore all the Collectors & Chief Rationing Officer, Hyderabad are hereby instructed to identify the eligible BPL families of Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs) under AAY Scheme within the targets assigned to their districts duly following the guidelines prescribed by the Government of India from time to time.

ORDER:-

In the G.Os. 1st to 7th read above, orders were issued by the Government on constitution of Medical Boards, Assessment of disabilities, Constitution of Appellate Medical Boards, percentage of disability for facilities, concessions and benefits and action for producing of false certificates in claim of reservation etc.

2. The Government of India had enacted the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Right and Full Participation) Act, 1995 and the Act came into force in Andhra Pradesh on 7.2.1996. Keeping in view the enactment of the Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995 with Rules notified by Government of Andhra Pradesh and Government of India guidelines on evaluation of various disabilities and procedure for certification issued in 2001 and 2002 and superseding the orders issued from 1st to 7th read above, Government hereby issues the following comprehensive orders:

I. Definition of Disabilities:-

The following definitions mentioned in the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 and the National Trust for Welfare of Persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities Act, 1999 are adopted:

Disability therefore includes:-

- (i) blindness;
- (ii) low vision;
- (iii) leprosy cured;
- (iv) hearing impairment;
- (v) locomotor disability;
- (vi) mental Retardation;
- (vii) mental Illness

- a) Blindness refers to a condition where a person suffers from any of the following conditions, namely:-
 - (i) total absence of sight; or
 - (ii) visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses;
or
 - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse;

- b) Person with Low vision means a person with impairment of visual functioning even after treatment or standard refractive correction but who uses or is potentially capable of using vision for the planning or execution of a task with appropriate assistive device i.e., a person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any of the following categories:
- (i) Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees
 - (ii) Heminaopia with macular involvement
 - (iii) Attitudinal defect involving lower fields
- c) Leprosy cured person means a person who has been cured of leprosy, but is suffering from not less than 40% of disability as follows:-
- (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well a loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye lid but with no manifest deformity;
 - (ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
 - iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him from undertaking any gainful occupation; and the expression “Leprosy cured” shall be construed accordingly;
 - (iv) The “Leprosy Cured” persons generally become “Locomotor Disabled” and the Medical Certificate may, in such cases have to be issued under the category of Locomotor Disability.
- d) Hearing impairment means loss of sixty decibels or more in the better ear in the conversational range of frequencies.
- e) Locomotor disability means disability of the bones, joints or muscles leading to substantial restrictions of the movement of the limbs which includes Dwarfs, persons with Hunch back, leprosy cured persons, persons suffering from Muscular Dystrophy or any form of Cerebral palsy.
- f) Cerebral Palsy means a group of non progressive conditions of a person characterized by abnormal motor control posture resulting from brain insult or injuries occurring in the pre-natal, peri-natal or infant period of development.
- g) Mental retardation means a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person which is specially characterized by sub-normality of intelligence.

Categorization of Mental Retardation

Category	I Q	Percentage of Disability

- h) Mental illness means any mental disorder other than mental retardation.

Categories of Mental Illness

- i) Multiple disabilities means a combination of two or more disabilities as defined in Clause (i) of Section 2 of the Persons with Disabilities Act 1995 Act.

- j) Autism means a condition of uneven skill development primarily affecting the communication and social abilities of a person, marked by repetitive and ritualistic behaviors;

3. Person with disability means a person suffering from not less than forty percent of any disability as certified by a medical authority except Hearing Impairment. Hearing Impairment means loss of sixty decibels or more in the better ear in the conversational range of frequencies which corresponds to 85 dBs Hearing threshold on the audiogram in the better ear i.e., 85 dB hearing level in audiogram – 25 dB upper limit of normal hearing = 60 dB hearing loss as per provision under “Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995”.

II. Evaluation and Issue of Disability Certificate:

- i) The guidelines for evaluation of various disabilities and procedure for certification issued by the government of India in the 9th read above shall be followed (Annexure-I).
- ii) The Government hereby constitute the Medical Boards consisting of three members, of whom atleast one shall be a specialist/s in the particular field for assessing the disability / disabilities.
- iii) An Audiologist with M.Sc. (Speech & Hearing / Audiology Language and Speech Pathology {ASLP} or Equivalent) qualification having registration with Rehabilitation Council of India should be part of the Medical Board for issuing hearing disability certificates.
- iv) All the District Headquarters Hospitals /Government Teaching Hospitals are hereby notified as District Medical Boards and authorized to give certificates for persons with disabilities.
- v) Whenever required the Chairman of the Medical Board may co-opt other Experts/Specialists in addition to members comprising in the Medical Board.
- vi) Further, the Superintendent is authorized to nominate one of the Members in the Medical Board as his nominee to act as Chairman of the Medical Board.
- vii) Specified test as indicated in Annexure-I should be conducted by the Medical Board and recorded before certificate is issued.
- viii) The certificate would be valid for a period of five years or for such period as may be specified for those whose disability is temporary. For those who acquire permanent disability, the validity can be shown as permanent. The specimen copy of the disability certificate is enclosed (Annexure-II)
- ix) All the records pertaining to the assessment shall be kept in the custody of the concerned Superintendent of the Hospitals.
- x) On representation by the applicant, the Medical Board may review the decision having regard to all the facts and circumstances of the case and pass such order in the matter as it thinks fit within 20 days from the date of receipt of the application.
- xi) All the persons with disabilities shall be assessed afresh regarding percentage of disability. All the existing certificates shall be replaced by re-assessing the persons with disabilities by the concerned District Medical Board as per the new guidelines to be issued separately by Rural Development Department. For this purpose, the District Collector in consultation with the Superintendent, District Headquarters Hospitals and Superintendent of Teaching Hospitals are authorized to constitute required Medical Boards within the district. The old certificates shall become invalid after completion of the reassessment and issue of certificates afresh.
- xii) After completion of the assessment of the degree of disability of all the persons with disabilities in camp mode as per new guidelines, the Medical Boards shall meet atleast once in a fort-night in order to assess and issue Medical Board Certificates to new cases and left over persons with disabilities.

- (xiii) In case of loss of certificate, the concerned person with disabilities shall apply to the concerned Superintendent, District Headquarters Hospitals/Teaching Hospitals along with F.I.R. and non traceable certificate issued by the concerned police. The Medical Board after due assessment shall issue a Medical Board Certificate within 20 days from the date of receipt of the application.

III. Appellate Authority:-

- i) Government hereby constitutes State Appellate Medical authorities in the State to resolve the disputes regarding the degree of disability. The State Appellate Medical authority shall consist of the following persons:-
- Superintendent of the Institution Hospital : Chairman
 - Head of the department of concerned disability in Hospital/Institution
 - Expert in the specified field of handicapped i.e., ophthalmologist in the case of Visually Handicapped; ENT surgeon in the case of speech and Hearing Handicapped; Orthopaedic surgeon in the case of Orthopaedically Handicapped; Clinical Psychologist / Psychiatrist / Paediatrician; in the field of Mentally Handicapped; Psychiatrist in case of Mental illness whenever required.(to be nominated by the Chairman, Medical Board)

- ii) Disability wise Appellate Medical Boards are constituted as under:

a) Orthopaedically Handicapped/ Locomotor Disability/Leprosy cured/Dwarf/ Hunchback/ Gandhi Hospital, Hyderabad	Osmania General Hospital, Hyderabad./ Mascular Dystrophy
b) Blindness/ Low vision	Sarojini Devi Eye Hospital, Hyderabad.
c) Mental Retardation	Institute of Mental Health, Hyderabad / National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped
d) Mental Illness	State Institute of Mental Health, Hyderabad
e) Hearing Impairment	Govt. ENT Hospital, Koti, Hyderabad.

- iii) The Chairman, Appellate Medical authority may co-opt other experts whenever required.
- iv) The Director General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare will be the final authority, should there arise any confusion / doubt regarding the interpretation of the definition / classification / evaluation lists etc.

IV. Action for fraudulently availing any benefit meant for Persons With Disabilities:-

- It has been represented to the Government that some normal persons are being appointed to various posts based on bogus medical certificates resulting in denial of the benefit to the genuinely disabled persons apart from injustice to the meritorious open category candidates.
- All the Heads of Departments, the District Collectors appointing authorities are therefore requested to carefully verify the Medical certificates produced by the individuals and verify the genuineness before allowing them to appear for selection tests etc.
- All cases of Hearing Impaired shall necessarily be referred to ENT Hospital for confirmation before issue of appointment orders.
- Regarding doubtful cases of other categories they may be referred to the concerned State Appellate Medical Board for confirmation or otherwise of disability status, i.e. Sarojini Devi Eye Hospital, Hyderabad for Visually Handicapped and Gandhi Hospital/Osmania Hospital, Hyderabad for Orthopaedically Handicapped.
- Effective follow up action including prosecution/removal from service following the due procedure shall be taken in all cases of false claims based on fake/false certificate etc.
- Those who fraudulently avail or attempt to avail any benefit meant for persons with disabilities, shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to twenty thousand rupees or with both as prescribed under Section 69 of Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995.

- (vii) In addition those who attempt to seek employment on the basis of false medical board certificate i.e., certificates obtained by misrepresentation /clandestine manner etc., which tantamount to cheating shall also be debarred from Government employment for a period of 5 years.
- (viii) Issue of Handicapped Certificates to ineligible persons i.e. without following prescribed procedure/proper evaluation shall entail stringent action against all concerned.

V) RESERVATION OF POSTS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES:

- i) Trifurcation of 3% reservation in favour of Physically Handicapped persons in so far as direct recruitment, subject to the condition that the categorization of the physically handicapped persons for the purpose of reservation in consonance with Sec.33 of Persons With Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 in employment, shall be as under:

Category of disability	% of Reservation
1. blindness or low vision	1%
2. hearing impairment	1%
3. locomotor disability or cerebral palsy	1%.

- ii) If relevant factors governing recruitment are equal, preference in employment shall be given to the persons with disabilities having higher degree of disability.

4. The General Administration (Services) Department may take necessary action for amendment of A.P. State and Subordinate Service Rules accordingly.

5. The Commissioner, Department for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens is request to take necessary action accordingly.

Subject:-Guidelines for evaluation of various disabilities and procedure for certification.

No. 16-18/97-NI. I.-In order to review the guidelines for evaluation of various disabilities and procedure for certification as given in the Ministry of Welfare's O.M. No. 4-2/83-HW.-III, dated the 6th August, 1986 and to recommend appropriate modifications/alterations keeping in view the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, Government of India in Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, vide Order No. 16-18/97-NI. I, dated 28-8-1998, set up four committees under the Chairmanships of Director General of Health Services-one each in the area of mental retardation, Locomotor/ Orthopaedic disability, Visual disability and Speech & Hearing disability. Subsequently, another Committee was also constituted on 21-7-1999 for evaluation, assessment of multiple disabilities and categorization and extent of disability and procedures for certification.

2. After having considered the reports of these committees the undersigned is directed to convey the approval of the President to notify the guidelines for evaluation of following disabilities and procedure for certification:-

1. Visual impairment
2. Locomotor / Orthopaedic disability
3. Speech & hearing disability
4. Mental retardation
5. Multiple Disabilities

Copy of the Report is enclosed herewith as **Annexure**.

3. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% in order to be eligible for any concessions/benefits.

4. According to the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Rules, 1996 notified on 31.12.1996 by the Central Government in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) and (2) of section 73 of the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (1 of 1996), authorities to give disability Certificate will be a Medical Board duly constituted by the Central and the State Government. The State government may constitute a Medical Board consisting of at least three members out of which at least one shall be a specialist in the particular field for assessing locomotor/ Visual including low vision/hearing and speech disability, mental retardation and leprosy cured, as the case may be.

5. Specified test as indicated in Annexure should be conducted by the medical board and recorded before a certificate is given.

6. The certificate would be valid for a period of five years for those whose disability is temporary. For those who acquire permanent disability, the validity can be shown as 'Permanent'.

7 The State Governments/UT Administrations may constitute the medical boards indicated in para 4 above immediately, if not done so far.

8 The Director General of Health Services Ministry of Health and Family Welfare will be the final authority, should there arise any Controversy / doubt regarding the interpretation of the definitions / classifications / evaluations tests etc.

APPENDIX.III

A. MENTAL RETARDATION

1. Definition:- Mental retardation is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of the mind, which is especially characterised by impairment of skills manifested during the development period which contribute to the over all level of intelligence, i.e., cognitive, language, motor and social abilities.

2. Categories of Mental Retardation:-

2.1 Mild Mental Retardation:- The range of 50 to 69 (standardised IQ test) is indicative of mild retardation. Understanding and use of language tend to be delayed to a varying independence may persist into adult life.

2.2 Moderate Mental Retardation: - The IQ is in the range of 35 to 49. Discrepant profiles of abilities are common in this group with some individuals achieving higher levels in visuo-spatial skills than in tasks dependent on language while others are markedly clumsy by enjoy social interaction and simple conversation. The level of development of language is variable: some of those affected can take part in simple conversations while others have only enough language to communicate their basic needs.

2.3 Severe Mental Retardation:- The IQ is usually in the range of 20 to 34. In this category, most of the people suffer from a marked degree of motor impairment or other associated deficits indicating the presence of clinically significant damage to or mal-development of the central nervous system.

2.4 Profound Mental Retardation: - The IQ in this category estimated to be under 20. The ability to understand or comply with requests or instructions are severally limited. Most of such individuals are immobile or severally restricted in mobility, incontinent and capable at most of only very rudimentary forms of non-verbal communication. They posses little or no ability to care for their own basic needs and require constant help and supervision,

3. Process of Certifications:-

3.1 A disability certificate shall be issued by a Medical Board consisting of three members duly constituted by the Central/State Government. At least, one shall be a Specialist in the area of mental retardation, namely. Psychiatrist, Paediatrician and clinical Psychologist.

3 2 The examination process will consist of three components, namely, clinical assessment, assessment, of adaptive behaviour and intellectual functioning.

B. VISUAL DISABILITY

1. Definition: - Blindness refers to a condition where a persons suffers from any of the condition, namely,

- i) total absence of sight; or
- ii) visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200(snellen) in the better eye with best correcting lenses; or
- iii) limitation of field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse;

2. Low Vision: - Persons with low vision means a person a with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:-

- a) reduction of fields less than 50 degrees
- b) Heminaopia with macular involvement
- c) Altitudinal defect involving lower fields.

3. Categories of Visual Disability

Note: F.C. means Finger Count

4. Process of Certification

A disability certificate shall be issued by a Medical Board duly constituted by the Central/State Government having, at least three members. Out of which, at least one member shall be a specialist in ophthalmology.

B. SPEECH & HEARING DISABILITY

1. Definition of Hearing: - A persons with hearing impairment having difficulty of various degrees in hearing sounds is an impaired person.

2. Categories of Hearing Impairment.

i) Pure tone average of hearing in 500, and 2000 HZ, 4000 HZ by conduction (AC and BC) should be taken as basis for consideration as per the test recommendations.

ii) When there is only as island of hearing present in one or two frequencies in better ear, it should be considered as total loss of hearing.

iii) Wherever there is no response (NR) at any of the 4 frequencies (500, 1000,2000 and 4000 HZ), it should be considered as equivalent to 100 dB loss for the purpose of classification of disability and in arriving at the average.

NOTE:- Category –I, II (a) above in the statement are not eligible for any benefits as per Clause (I) Section 2 of PWD Act, 1995 and as per Guidelines applicable in Andhra Pradesh in the spirit of PWD Act, 1995

3. Process of Certification

A disability certificate shall be issued by a Medical Board duly constituted by the Central and the State Government. Out of which, at least, one member shall be a specialist in the field of ENT.

C. LOCOMOTOR DISABILITY

1 Definition:-

- i) **Impairment:** An impairment in any loss or abnormality of psychological, physiological or anatomical structure or function in a human being.
- ii) **Functional Limitations:** Impairment may cause functional limitations which are partial or total inability to perform those activities, necessary for motor, sensory or mental function within the range or manner of which a human being is normally capable.
- iii) **Disability:** A disability, is any restriction or lack. (resulting from an impairment) of ability to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for a human being.
- iv) **Locomotor Disability:** Locomotor disability is defined as a persons inability to execute distinctive activities associated with moving both himself and objects, from place to place and such inability resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal and/or nervous system.

2. Categories of Locomotor Disability

The categories of locomotor disabilities are enclosed at Annexure-A.

3. Process of Certification

A disability certificate shall be issued by a Medical Board of three members duly constituted by the Central and the State Government, out of which, at least, one member shall be a specialist from either the field of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation or Orthopaedics.

It was also decided that whenever required the Chairman of the Board may co-opt other experts including that of the members constituted for the purpose by the Central and the State Government.

On representation by the applicant, the Medical Board may review its decision having regard to all the facts and circumstances of the case and pass such order in the matter as it thinks fit.

ANNEXURE-A

LOCOMOTOR DISABILITY

REVISED GUIDELINES FOR EVALUATION OF THE PERMANENT PHYSICAL IMPAIRMENT

1.1 Guidelines for Evaluation of Permanent Physical Impairment of Upper Limb

1. The estimation of permanent impairment depends upon the measurement of functional impairment and is not expression of a personal opinion.
2. The estimation and measurement should be made when the clinical condition has reached the stage of maximum improvement from the medical treatment. Normally the time period is to be decided by the medical doctor who is evaluating the case for issuing the PPI Certificate as per standard format of the certificate.
3. The upper limb is divided into two component parts; the arm component and the hand component.
4. Measurement of the loss of function of arm component consists of measuring the loss of motion, muscle strength and co-ordinated activities
5. Measurement of loss of function of hand component consists of determining the prehension, sensation and strength. For estimation of prehension opposition, lateral pinch cylindrical grasp, spherical grasp and hook grasp have to be assessed as shown in Hand Component of Form A Assessment Proforma for upper extremity.

6. The impairment of the entire extremity depends on the combination of the functional impairments of both components

2 ARM COMPONENT

Total value of arm component is 90%

1.2.1 Principles of evaluation of range of motion (ROM) of joints

1. The value of maximum ROM in the arm component is 90%
2. Each of the three joints of the arm is weighed equally (30%;

Example:

The intra articular fractures of the bones of right shoulder joint may affect range of motion even after healing. The loss of ROM should be calculated in each arc of motion as envisaged in the Assessment Form A (Assessment Proforma for Upper Extremity).

Arc of ROM	Normal value	Active ROM	Loss of ROM
Shoulder Flexion-	0-220	110	50%
Rotation	0-180	90	50%
Abduction-Adduction	0-180	90	50%

Hence the mean loss of ROM of shoulder will be $50+50+50/3 = 150/3 = 50\%$ Shoulder movements constitute 30% of the motion of the arm component, therefore the loss of motion for arm component will be $50 \times 0.3 = 15\%$ If more than one joint of the arm is involved the loss of percentage in each joint is calculated separately as above and then added together.

1.2.2. Principles of evaluation of strength of muscles:

1. Strength of muscles can be tested by manual method and graded from 0-5 as advocated by Medical Research Council of Great Britain depending upon the strength of the muscles.
2. Loss of muscle power can be given percentages as follows:

Manual muscle Strength grading	Loss of Strength in percentage
0	100%
1	80%
2	60%
3	40%
4	20%
5	0%

3. The mean percentage of loss of muscle strength around a joint is multiplied by 0.30.
4. If loss of muscle strength involves more than one joint the mean loss of percentage in each joint is calculated separately and then added together as has been described for loss of motion.

1.2.3 Principles of evaluation of coordinated activities:

- 1 The total value for coordinated activities is 90% Ten different coordinated activities should be tested as given in **Form A. (Appendix.I of Annexure-A)**
2. Each activity has a value of 9%

1.2.4 Combining values for the Arm Component:

The total value of loss of function of arm component is obtained by combining the value of loss of ROM, muscle strength and coordinated activities, using the combining formula.

$$\frac{a+b(90-a)}{90}$$

where a = higher value
b = lower value

Example

Let us assume that an individual with an intra articular fracture of bones of shoulder joint in addition to 16.5% loss of motion in arm has 8.3% loss of strength of muscles and 5% loss of coordination. These values should be combined as follows:

Loss of ROM - 16.5%	$16.5 + \frac{8.3(90-16.5)}{90}$
Loss of strength of muscles - 8.3%	=23.33%
To add	
Loss of coordination - 5%	$23.3 + \frac{5(90-23.3)}{90} = 27.0\%$

So the total value of loss of function in Arm component will be 27.0%

1.3 HAND COMPONENT:

- 1 Total value of hand component is 90%
- 2 The functional impairment of hand is expressed as loss of prehension, loss of sensation and loss of strength

1.3.1 Principles of evaluation of prehension:

- 1 Total value of prehension is 30%
it includes
 - a) Opposition - 8%
Tested against
 - Index finger -2%
 - Middle finger-2 %
 - Ring -2%
 - Little finger - 2%
 - b) Lateral pinch -5% - Tested by asking the patient to hold a key between the thumb and lateral side of index finger.
 - c) Cylindrical grasp - 6% Tested for
 - i) Large object of 4 inches size -3%
 - ii) Small object of 1 inch size - 3%
 - d) Spherical grasp -6% Tested for
 - i) Large object of 4 inches size - 3%
 - ii) Small object of 1 inch size - 3%
 - e) Hook grasp - 5% -Tested by asking the patient to lift a bag

1.3.2. Principles of Evaluation of sensation:

1. Total value of sensation in hand is 30%
2. It should be assessed according to the distribution given below:
 - i) Complete loss of sensation
 - Thumb ray 9%
 - Index finger 6%

Middle finger 5%
Ring finger 5%
Little finger 5%

- ii) Partial loss of sensation: Assessment should be made according to percentage of loss of sensation in thumb/finger(s)

1 33. Principles of Evaluation of strength

1. Total value of strength is 30%
2. It includes:
 - i) Grip strength 20%
 - ii) Pinch strength 10%

Strength of hand should be tested with hand dynamo-meter or by clinical method (grip method).

Additional weightage - A total of 10% additional weightage can be given to following accompanying factors if they are continuous and persistent despite treatment

1. Pam
2. Infection
3. Deformity
4. Mat-alignment
5. Contractures
6. Cosmetic disfiguration
7. Dominant extremity-4%
8. Shortening of upper limb

First 1" - No weightage
For each 1" beyond first 1" -2%

The extra points should not exceed 10% of the total Arm Component and total PPI should not exceed 100% in any case.

1.3.4. Combining values of hand component:

The final value of loss of function of hand component is obtained by summing up values of loss of prehension, sensation and strength.

1.3.5. Combining values for the Extremity:

Values of impairment of arm component and impairment of hand component should be added by using combining formula:

$$\frac{a+b(90-a)}{90}$$

a= higher value
b= lower value

Example:

Impairment of Arm - 27% $\frac{64+27(90-64)}{90}$

Impairment of hand - 64% =71.8%

The total value can also be obtained by using the Ready Recknoer table for combining formula given at

Appendix.II of Annexure.A.

2. Guidelines for Evaluation of permanent physical Impairment in Lower Limb.

The measurement of loss of function in lower extremity is divided into two components: Mobility and standing components

2.1 Mobility Component:-

- 1 Total value of mobility component is 90%
2. It includes range of movement (ROM) and muscle strength

2.1.1. Principles of Evaluation of Range of Movement:

1. The value of maximum range of movement in mobility component is 90%
2. Each of three joints i.e. hip, knee and foot-ankle component is weighed equally - 30%.

Example:

A fracture of right hip joint bones may affect range of motion of the hip joint. Loss of ROM of the affected hip in different are should be assessed as given in Form B (Assessment Proforma for lower extremity). (**Appendix.I of Annexure.A**)

Affected Joint - Rt. Hip:

Arc of Movement	Normal ROM	Active ROM	Loss in percentage
Flexion-Extension	0-140	70	50%
Abduction-Adduction	0-90	60	33%
Rotations	0-90	30	66%

Mean loss of ROM of Rt Hip = $\frac{50+33+66}{3} = 50\%$

Since the hip constitute 30% of the total mobility component of the lower limb the loss of motion in relation to the lower limb will be $50 \times 0.30 = 15\%$

If more than one joint of the limb is involved the mean loss of ROM in percentage should be calculated in relation to individual joint separately and then added together as follows to calculate the loss of mobility component in relation to that particular limb.

For example.

Mean loss of ROM of Rt. Hip 50%
Mean loss of ROM Rt. Knee 40%
Loss of mobility component of Rt. Lower Limb will be
 $(50 \times 0.30) + (40 \times 0.30) = 27\%$

2.1.2. Principle of Evaluation of Muscle Strength:

1. The value for maximum muscle strength in the limb is 90%
2. Strength of muscles can be tested by Manual Method and graded 0-5 as advocated by MRC of Great Britain depending upon the residual strength in the muscle group.
- 3 Manual muscle grading can be given percentage like below:

Power Grade of Ms	Loss of strength in percentage
0	100%
1	80%
2	60%
3	40%
4	20%
5	0%

4. Mean percentage of muscle strength loss around a joint is multiplied by 0.30 to calculate loss in relation to limb
5. If there has been a loss muscle strength involving more than one joint the values are added as has been described for loss of ROM

2.1.3. Combining values for mobility component:

1. The values of loss of ROM and loss of muscle strength should be combined with the help of combining formula: $a + \frac{b(90-a)}{90}$
(a = higher value, b = lower value)

Example: Let us assume that the individual with a fracture of right hip bones has in addition to 16% loss of motion, 8% loss of muscle strength also Combined values

Motion-16% $16 + \frac{8(90-16)}{90}$

Strength-8% =22.6%

2.2 Stability component:

1. Total value of the stability component is 90%
2. It should be tested by clinical method as given in Form B (Assessment Proforma for lower extremity). There are nine activities, which need to be tested, and each activity has a value of ten per cent (10%). The percentage valued in relation to each activity depends upon the percentage of loss stability in relation to each activity.

2.3 Extra points:

Extra points have been given for pain, deformities, contractures, loss of sensations and shortening Maximum points to be added are 10% (excluding shortening). Details are as following.

3. Guidelines for Evaluation of Permanent Physical Impairment of Trunk (Spine)

Basic guidelines:

1. As permanent physical impairment caused by spinal deformity tends to change over the years, the certificate issued in relation to spine should be reviewed as per the standard format of the certificate given at **Annexure -B of Appendix.III.**
2. Permanent physical impairment should be awarded in relation to spine and not in relation to whole body.
3. Permanent physical impairment due to neurological deficit in addition to spinal impairment should be added

by combining formula. The local effects of the lesions of the spine can be conventionally divided into traumatic and non-traumatic. The percentage of PPI in relation to each situation should be valued as follows:

3.1 TRAUMATIC LESIONS:

3.1.1 Cervical spine injuries

3.2 NON TRAUMATIC LESIONS:

3.2.1 Scoliosis:

Basic guidelines - following modification is suggested.

- The largest structural curve should be accounted for while calculating the PPI and not the compensatory curve or both structural curves.

3.2.2 Measurement of Spine Deformity:

Cobb’s method for measurement, of angle of curve in the radiograph taken in standing position should be used. The curves have been divided into following groups depending upon the angle of major structural scoliotic deformity.

3.2.3 Torso Imbalance:

In addition to the above PPI should also be evaluated in relation the torso imbalance. The torso imbalance should be measured by dropping a plumb line from C7 spine and measuring the distance of plumb line from gluteal crease.

3.2.6 Associated Problems: To be added directly but the total value of PPI in relation to spine should not exceed 100%.

- a) Pain
 - mildly interfering with ADL 4%
 - moderately restricting ADL 6%
 - severely restricting ADL 10%
- b) Cosmetic Appearance:
 - No obvious disfiguration with clothes on Nil
 - mild disfigurement 2%
 - severe disfigurement 4%
- c) Leg Length Discrepancy.
 - First 1/2 " shortening Nil
 - Every 1/2" beyond first 1/2" 4%
- d) Neurological deficit - Neurological deficit should be calculated as per established method of evaluation of PPI in such cases. Value thus obtained should be added telescopically using combining formula.

4. Guidelines for Evaluation of PPI in cases of Short Stature/Dwarfism:

1. Recumbent length or longitudinal height below 3rd percentile or less than 2 Standard Deviation from the mean is considered to have short stature.
2. The evaluation of a Short Statured person should be considered only when it is of disproportionate variety and is accompanied by an underlying pathological conditions, e.g., Achondroplasia, Chondrodysplasia Punctata, spondyloepiphyseal dysplasia, mucopolysaccharidosis and acrochondroplasia, etc.
3. The ICMR norms as enclosed at Appendix III of Annexure. A should be used as a guideline for the height.
4. Every 1" vertical height reduction should be valued as 4% permanent physical impairment.
5. Associated skeletal deformities should be evaluated, separately and total percentage of both should be added by combining formula.

5. Guidelines for Evaluation of Permanent Physical Impairment in Amputees:

Basic Guidelines:

1. In cases of multiple amputees if the total sum of permanent physical impairment is above 100%, it should be taken as 100% only.
2. If the stump is unfit for fitting the prosthesis additional weightage of 5% should be added to the value.
3. In case of amputation in more than one limb percentage of each limb is added by combining formula and another 10% will be added but when only toes or fingers are involved only 5% will be added
4. Any complication in form of stiffness of proximal joint, neuroma infection, etc., should be given upto a total of 10% additional weightage.
5. Dominant upper extremity should be given 4% additional weightage.

6. Guidelines for Evaluation of Permanent Physical Impairment of Congenital deficiencies of the limbs.

6.1 Transverse Deficiencies-

1. Functionally congenital transverse limb deficiencies are comparable to acquired amputations and can be called synonymously as congenital amputation, however, in some cases revision of amputation is required to fit in a prosthesis.

2. The transverse limb deficiencies therefore should be assessed on basis of the guidelines applicable to the evaluation of PPI in cases of amputees as given in the preceding chapter.

For example:

6.2 Longitudinal Deficiencies:

6.2.1 Basic Guidelines

1. In cases of longitudinal deficiencies of limbs due consideration should be given to functional impairment
2. In upper limb, loss of ROM loss muscular strength and hand functions like prehension, etc should be tested while assessing the case for PPI
3. In lower limb clinical method of stability component and shortening of lower limb should be given due weightage.
- 4 Apart from functional assessment the lost joint/part of body should also be valued as per distribution Given in chapter Guidelines for Evaluation of PPI in upper extremity and lower extremity The values so obtained should be added with the help of combining formula

Example: Congenital Absence of humerus where forearm bones directly articulate with scapula.

There will be mild reduction in ROM and strength of muscles in the existing joints apart from loss of body part.

Loss of shoulder joint can be given - 30% Loss of ROM of Elbow/Shoulder & Wrist

All the components should be added together by the combining formula of

$$a + \frac{b(90-a)}{90}$$

6.2.2 In cases of loss of single bone in forearm the evaluation should be based on the principles of evaluation of Arm component which include Evaluation of ROM, Muscle strength-and coordinated activities. The values so obtained should be added together with the help of combining formula.

6.2.3 In cases of loss of single bone in leg the evaluation should be based on the principles of evaluation of mobility component and stability components of the lower extremity. The values obtained should be added together with the help of combining formula.

7.Guidelines for Evaluation of Physical Impairments in Neurological conditions.

1.1 Basic Guidelines:

1. Assessment in neurological conditions is not the assessment of disease but the assessment of its effects, i.e. clinical manifestations.
2. These guidelines should only be used for central and upper motor neurone lesions.
3. Proformas (form A & B) will be utilized for assessment of lower motor neurone lesions, muscular disorders and other locomotor conditions.
4. Normally any neurological assessment for the purpose of certification has to be done six months after the onset of disease however exact time period is to be decided by the Medical Doctor who is evaluating the case and has to recommend the review of certificate as given in the standard format of certificate.
5. Total percentage of physical impairment in any neurological condition should not exceed 100%
6. In mixed cases the highest score will be taken into consideration. The lower score will be added telescopically to it by the help of combining formula
$$a + \frac{b(90-a)}{90}$$
7. Additional rating of 4% will be given for dominant upper extremity.
8. Additional weightage up to 10% can be given for loss of sensation in each extremity but the total physical impairment should not exceed 100%.

8 Guidelines for Evaluation of Physical Impairment due to Cardiopulmonary Diseases.

8.1 Basic Guidelines:-

1. Modified New York Heart Association subjective classification should be utilised to assess the functional disability.
2. The assessing physician should be alert to the fact that patients who come for disability claims are likely to exaggerate their symptoms. In case of any doubt patients should be referred for detailed physiological evaluation.
3. Disability evaluation of cardiopulmonary patients should be done after full medical, surgical and rehabilitative treatment available, because most of these diseases are potentially treatable.
4. Assessment of cardiopulmonary impairment should also be done in diseases which might have associated cardiopulmonary problems, e.g., amputees, myopathies, etc.
5. For respiratory assessment, routine respiratory functions test should be done, however, in cases of interstitial lung diseases, diffusion studies may be done.
6. In cases of Angina pectoris (chest pain) base line studies in resting ECG should be done. When there is persistence of symptoms, exercise or stress test should be done.

8.2 The proposed classification with loss of function is as follows:-

Group 0: A patient with cardiopulmonary disease who is asymptomatic (i.e. has no symptoms of breathlessness, palpitation, fatigue or chest pain).

Group 1: A patient with cardiopulmonary disease who becomes symptomatic during his ordinary physical activity but has mild restriction (25%) of his physical activities.

Group 2: A patient with cardiopulmonary disease who becomes symptomatic during his ordinary physical activity and has 25-50% restriction of his ordinary physical activities.

Group 3: A patient with cardiopulmonary disease who becomes symptomatic during less than ordinary physical activity so that his ordinary physical activities are 50-75% restricted.

Group 4: A patient with cardiopulmonary disease who is symptomatic even at rest or on mildest exertion so that his ordinary physical activities are severely or completely restricted (75-100%).

Group 5: A patient with cardiopulmonary disease who gets intermittent symptoms at rest (i.e. patients with bronchial asthma, paroxysmal nocturnal dyspnoea, etc.)

1. Definition of Multiple Disabilities: Multiple disabilities means a combination of two or more disabilities as defined in clause (i) of Section (2) of the Persons with Disabilities. (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, namely -

- I. Locomotor disability including leprosy cured
- II. Blindness/low vision
- III. Speech and hearing impairment
- IV. Mental retardation
- V. Mental illness.

2. Guidelines for Evaluation: - In order to evaluate the multiple disability, the same guidelines shall be used as have been developed by the respective sub-committees of various single disability, viz. Mental retardation, locomotor disability, visual disability, and speech and hearing disability and recommended in the meeting held on 29.2.2000 under the Chairmanship of Dr. S.P. Agarwal, Director General of Health Services, Government of India, with reference to Order No.16-18/96-N.I.I, dated 28th August, 1998 and communicated to Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India, vide letter No.S-13020/4/98-MH, dated 16th March, 2000.

However, in order to arrive at the total percentage of multiple disability, the combining formula

$$a + \frac{b(90-a)}{90}$$
 as given in the "Manual for Doctors to Evaluate

Permanent Physical Impairment, Developed by Expert Group meeting on Disability Evaluation", shall be used, where "a" will be the higher score and "b" Will be the lower score. However, the maximum total percentage of multiple disabilities shall not exceed 100%.

For example, if the percentage of hearing disability is 30% and visual disability is 20%, then by applying the combining formula given above, the total percentage of multiple disability will be calculated as follows:-

$$30 + \frac{20(90-30)}{90} = 43\%$$

3. Procedure for Certification of Multiple Disabilities:-

The procedure will remain the same as has been developed by the respective sub-committees on various single disabilities and finalized in a meeting under the Chairpersonship of Dr. S.P. Agarwal held on 29.2.2000. The final disability certificate for multiple disability will be issued by Disability Board which has given higher score of disability by combining the score of different disabilities using the combining formula, i.e.,

$$a + \frac{b(90-a)}{90}$$
 In case, where two scores of disability are

equal, the final certificate of multiple disability will be issued by any one of them as decided by Local authority

Subject - Guidelines for evaluation and assessment of mental illness and procedure for certification.

No. 16-18/97-NI. 1. Mental illness has been recognized as one of the disabilities under Section 2 (i) of the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995. "Mental illness" has been defined under Section 2(q) of the said Act as any mental disorder other than mental retardation.

2. In order to prescribe guidelines for evaluation and assessment of mental illness and procedure for certification, a Committee was constituted by the Department of Health, Government of India vide Order dated 6th August, 2001 under the Chairmanship of Director General of Health Services on the basis of request made by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. The Committee has submitted its report.

3. After having considered the report of the Committee, the undersigned is directed to convey the approval of the President to notify the guidelines for evaluation and assessment of mental illness and procedure for certification. Copy of the Report is enclosed herewith as ANNEXURE A.

4. The minimum degree of disability should be 40%. in order to be eligible for any concessions/benefits.

5. According to the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Rules, 1996 notified by the Central Government in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) and (2) of Section 73 of the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (I of 1996): authorities to give Disability Certificate will be a Medical Board duly constituted by the Central or the State Government. The Committee has recommended that certification of disability for the purposes of the Act may be carried out by a Medical Board comprising of the following members -

6. At least two of the members, including Chairperson of the Board must be present and sign the disability certificate.

7. The State Governments are, therefore, requested to constitute Medical Boards as indicated above immediately.

8. Specified test as indicated in ANNEXURE A should be conducted by the medical board and recorded before a certificate is given.

9. The certificate would be valid for a period of five years for those whose disability is temporary and are below the age 18 years. For those who acquire permanent disability, the validity can be shown as 'Permanent in the certificate'.

10. The Director General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare shall be the final authority, should there arise any controversy/doubt regarding the interpretation of the definitions/classifications/evaluation tests etc.

ANNEXURE A
MINUTES OF THE MEETING

Minutes of the meeting of the committee to review the definition of mental illness and formulating guidelines for assessment of mental illness disability and procedure for certification held on 27th September 2001 (Thursday) under the Chairmanship of DGHS.

A meeting was held under the Chairmanship of DGHS on 27th September to review the definition of mental illness and formulating guidelines for assessment of mental illness disability and procedure for certification.

1. After detailed discussion consensus was reached on the view that the present definition of "mental illness" as contained in the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 section 2 (q) may be retained unchanged. This will be most suitable for the purpose of PWD Act.

2. With regard to assessment of disability related to mental illness it was agreed that the Indian Disability Evaluation and Assessment Scale (IDEAS) developed by the Rehabilitation Committee of the Indian Psychiatric Society (IPS) through a task force should be used with modifications for the purposes of the Act. The modified scale, IDEAS is appended.

3. The Committee further recommended that certification of disability for the purposes of the Act may be carried out by, a medical board comprising of the following members:

4. Meeting ended with the vote of thanks to the chair.

Indian Disability Evaluation and Assessment Scale)

Ascale for measuring and quantifying disability in mental disorders.

Items -

I. Self Care: Includes taking care of body hygiene, grooming, health including bathing, toileting, dressing, eating, taking care of one's health.

II. Interpersonal Activities (Social Relationships): Includes initiating and maintaining interactions with others in contextual and social appropriate manner.

III. Communication and Understanding: Includes communication and conversation with others by producing and comprehending spoken/written/non-verbal messages.

IV. Work: Three areas are Employment/Housework/ Education Measures on any aspect.

1. Performing in Work/Job: Performing in work/employment (paid) employment/self-employment/ family concern or otherwise. Measure ability to perform tasks at employment completely and efficiently and in proper time. Includes seeking employment.
2. Performing in Housework: Maintaining household including cooking, caring for other people at home, taking care of belongings etc. Measures ability to take responsibility for and perform household tasks completely and efficiently and in proper time.
3. Performing in school/college: Measures performance education related tasks.

Scores for each item:

- 0- NO disability (none, absent, negligible)
- 1- MILD disability (slight, low)
- 2- MODERATE disability (medium, fair)
- 3- SEVERE disability (high, extreme)
- 4- PROFOUND disability (total cannot do)

MANUAL FOR "IDEAS" -

In order to score this instrument, information from all possible sources should be obtained. This will include interview of patient, the care given and case notes when available.

1. SELF CARE: This should be regarded as activity guided by social norms and conventions. The broad areas covered are

a. Maintenance of personal hygiene and physical health.

b. Eating habits

c. Maintenance of personal belongings and living space

a. Does he look after himself. wash his clothes regularly, take a bath and brush his teeth?

b. DOES he have regular meals?

c. Does he take food of right quality and quantity?

d. What about his table manners?

e. Does he take care of his personal belongings with reasonable standard of cleanliness and orderliness?

0 = No disability

Patient's level and pattern of self-care are normal, within the social cultural and economic context.

1= Mild

Mild deterioration in self-care and appearance (not bathing. shaving, changing clothes for the occasion as

expected). Does not have adverse consequences such as hazards to his health. No embarrassment to family.

2= Moderate

Lack of concern for self-care should be clearly established such as mild deterioration of physical health, obesity, tooth decay &, body odors.

3= Severe

Decline in self-care should be marked in all areas. Patient wearing torn clothes would only wash if made to and would only eat if fed. Evidence of serious hazards to physical health. (Malnutrition, infection, patient unacceptable in public).

4= Profound

Total or near total lack of self-care (Example: risk to physical survival, needs feeding, washing, putting on clothes etc., Constant supervision necessary)

II. Inter Personal Activities

Includes patient's response to questions, requests and demands of others, activities or regulating emotions, activities of initiating, maintaining and terminating interactions and activities of engaging in physical intimacy.

Guiding Questions

- a. What is his behaviour with others?
- b. Is he polite?
- c. Does he respond to questions!
- d. Is he able to regulate verbal and physical aggression?
- e. Is he able to act independently in social interactions?
- f. How does he behave with strangers?
- g. Is he able to maintain friendship?
- h. Does he show physical expression of affection and desire?

Scoring

0= No

Patient gets along reasonably well with people, personal relationships No friction in inter-personal relationships.

1= Mild

Some friction on isolated occasions. Patient known to be nervous or irritable but generally tolerated by others.

2= Moderate

Factual evidence that pattern of response to people is unhealthy. May be seen on more than few occasions. Could isolate himself from others and avoid company.

3= Severe

Behaviour in social situations is undesirable and generalized. Causes serious problems in daily living/or work. Patient is socially ostracized.

4= Profound

Patient in serious and lasting conflict, serious danger to problems of others. Family afraid of potential consequences.

III. Communication and Understanding

Understanding spoken messages as well as written and non-verbal messages and ability to respond to messages in order to communicate with others.

1. Questions

- a. Does he avoid talking to people?
- b. When people come home what does he do?
- c. Does he ever visit others?
- d. Is he able to start, maintain and end a conversation?
- e. Does he understand body language and emotions of others such as smiling, crying, screaming, etc.,
- f. Does he indulge in reading and writing?
- g. Do you encourage him to be more sociable?

Scoring:

0 = No disability

Patient mixes, talks and generally interacts with people as much as can be expected in his socio-cultural context. No evidence of avoiding people.

1= Mild

Patient described as uncommunicative or solitary in social situations. Signs of social anxiety might be reported.

2= Moderate

A very narrow range of social contacts, evidence of active avoidance of people on some occasions and interference with performance of social rules causes concern to family.

3= Severe

Evidence of more generalized, active avoidance of contact with people (leave the room when visitors arrive and would not answer the door or phone).

4= Profound

Hardly has any contacts and actively avoids people nearly all the time. Eg : may lock himself inside the room. Verbal communication is nil or a bare minimum.

IV. Work

This includes employment, housework and educational performance. Score only one category in case of an overlap.

Employment:

Guiding Questions

- Is he employed/unemployed?
- If employed, does he go to work regularly?
- Does he like his job and coping well with it?
- Can you rely on him financially?
- If unemployed, does he make efforts to find job?

Scoring:

0= No disability.

Patient goes to work regularly and his output and quality of work performance are within acceptable levels for the job.

1= Mild

Noticeable decline in patient's ability to work, to cope with it and meet the demands of work. May threaten to quit.

2= Moderate

Declining work performance, frequent absences, lack of concern about all this. Financial difficulties foreseen.

3= Severe

Marked decline in work performance, disruptive at work, unwilling to adhere to disciplines of work. Threat of losing his job.

4= Profound

Has been largely absent from work, termination imminent. Unemployed and making no efforts to find jobs.

In similar ways, housewives should be rated on the amount, regularity and efficiency in which tasks in the following areas are completed. Consider the amount of help required completing these. Acquiring daily necessities, making, storing and serving of food, cleaning the house, working with those helping with domestic duties such as maids, cooks etc., looking after possessions and valuable in the house.

Students - Assess a score on performance in school/college, regularity, discipline, interest in future studies, behaviour at the educational institution. Those who had to discontinue education on account of mental disability and unable to continue further should be given a score of 4.

Requests made by the District Officers'/ HoDs during review meetings and requests by Philanthropists.

ORDER :

Government with a view to provide shelter, protection and opportunities for development to women and children in need of care and protection has established institutions like Children Homes, Special Homes, Observation Homes, State Homes for women, Hostels and Residential Schools for disabled etc. Apart from these institutions, services are also being rendered to children under 6 years, pregnant mothers through Anganwadi centres under the Integrated Child Development Scheme. Some of these institutions are functioning without proper amenities- and inadequate infrastructure. However, there is ample scope for improving the infrastructure and standards in these institutions as many individuals/ organizations have expressed desire to contribute their mite for such improvements.

2. Government with a view to provide access to quality facilities/ services propose to enlist participation from such willing philanthropic individuals/ organizations. The details of the institutions functioning under each Head of Department, i.e Women Development & Child Welfare, Department for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens and Department of Juvenile Welfare, Correctional Services and Welfare of Street Children are available on the department website <http://wcdsc.ap.nic.in> or at the Institution concerned.

3. Government, after careful examination of the matter, hereby authorize the Director/ Commissioner, Women Development & Child Welfare; the Commissioner, Department for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens and the Director, Juvenile Welfare, Correctional Services & Welfare of Street Children or District Collectors concerned to accept contributions / donations / lands / buildings etc from philanthropic individuals / organizations as per the guidelines annexed to this GO (Annexure I). Head of Institutions may similarly receive contributions in kind.

4. The contributions made to National Children Fund under Director, WD & CW Department., and Juvenile Welfare Fund under JW, CS & WSC Department., are exempted from Income Tax. Similarly, Commissioner, Department for the Welfare of Disabled and Senior Citizens and the Commissioner/ Director, WD & CW shall obtain Income Tax exemption for the Fund to be started under his / her control.

- III. Those who desire to donate building after construction should construct the building as per the approved type design as approved by the Head of Department / Government for that particular institution.
- IV. The donations/ contributions/land/ building donated should not be diverted or nor should there be deviation from the original agreement or for the purpose for which it is made by the donor. In case of unavoidable circumstances warranting such deviation, it should be done with the consent of the donor.
- V. All such contributions including contributions in kind such as books, musical instruments, games material etc shall be utilized strictly, (provided the same is acceptable to the Head of the Institution) for the benefit of the inmates and in such manner as desired by the donor.
- VI. Any diversion or misuse of such contribution by any staff shall entail stringent action and prosecution.
- VII. Instructors including retired teachers, employees etc who are willing to teach yoga/ music/ dance /musical instruments /conduct debates and any such activity to develop skills etc can render their services on voluntary basis. Their services will be utilized subject to verification of their antecedents, character, and reputation etc by the head of the institution. After such verification and permission of Head of the Department at District level and District Collector, the services of such persons shall be used during day time only upto 5:00 PM. Only women instructors will be allowed to teach in girl's institutions. The particulars of all such volunteers shall be made available to District Officer concerned and posted on the website.
- VIII. Sponsorers willing to encourage the achievement of the inmates in studies as well as in other fields can sponsor studies in institutions of repute or sponsor awards/ trophies/ medals /cash incentives etc to the best performers/ best institutions in state or district, based on such assessment / criteria as they may prescribe which shall be fair and transparent and should be acceptable to Head of the Department as well.
- IX. All Heads of Departments / District Heads and all institution heads shall invariably update the information of respective institutions on the website on 1st of April and 1st October every year.
- X. The contribution shall be made as indicated in the website i.e through an account payee cheque in favour of the Head of the Department of that institution as shown below. Cash transactions should not be entertained.

CONCESSIONS OFFERED BY THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT TO THE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

1. TRAVEL CONCESSIONS FOR THE DISABLED

(a) By Train

As per the order of Ministry of Railways, Government of India, the allowing concessions are available for the disabled:

i) Blind Person

The blind person travelling alone or with an escort, on production of a certificate from Government doctor or a registered medical practitioner, is eligible to get the concession as below:

The concession certificate may be issued by the Station Master on collection of the certificate form and the copy of original certificate duly attested by a Gazetted Officer, M.P., M.L.A, etc. may be produced while collecting the ticket. The blind person may not be present at the station for purchase of the ticket.

(ii) Orthopaedically Handicapped Person

The orthopaedically handicapped person travelling with an escort, on production of a certificate from a Government doctor to the effect that the person concerned is orthopaedically handicapped and cannot travel without the assistance of an escort, is eligible for getting concession.

(iii) Deaf & Dumb Person

A Deaf & Dumb person travelling alone (both afflictions together in the same person) on production of a certificate from a government doctor is eligible for the concession.

A Mentally Retarded person, accompanied by an escort, on production of a certificate in the prescribed form, from a government doctor, is eligible to get the concession.

Note: Mentally Retarded person is permitted to travel by 2-tier A.C. Sleeper on payment of concessional fare for first class and full surcharge for 2-tier A.C. Sleeper.

Facility of issue of concessional return ticket will also be available in one month from the date of commencement of outward journey. M.R. person should be given preference in allotment of coupe on reservation in first class, if required. Free ticket for one escort is available for every two persons in the same class of carriage whether they hold adult or half ticket.

All the concessional fares shall be calculated on the basis of the basic railway fare for the journey. No person/party will be allowed more than one concession at one time.

The holder of a concession ticket will not be permitted to change the ticket to a higher class by paying the difference except in the case of T.B. and Cancer patient, leprosy patient, etc. The break-up journey shall not be allowed on a concession ticket for a specific journey, for example, students travelling for an examination centre, patient travelling to/from a hospital, professor travelling from/to a conference, etc. The break journey will be allowed only if it is a natural event. During break journey, the passenger has to endorse the ticket alongwith Station Master's initial, date and station code. Refund of the untravelled journey on such tickets will not be allowed.

(b) By Air

(i) Blind Persons

The Indian Airlines Corporation allows 50 percent concessional fare to blind persons on single journey or single fare round trip journey on all domestic flights. To avail this facility (for blind persons) they have to produce a certificate from a medical practitioner. Air Hostess/Steward will look after the blind persons not accompanied by escorts in flight. The Public Relation Officer or the Traffic Officer Incharge at the airport will tender necessary assistance to such infirm passengers at the airport. Escorts are to pay full fare. This concession cannot be combined with any other concessional fare allowed by the Indian Airlines.

(ii) Locomotor Disability

Locomotor Disabled persons (80% and above) are allowed following concessions in Indian Airlines :

- (a) 50% of Normal Economy Class INR Fare or Point to Point Fare. Full Inland Air Travel Tax and Passenger Service Fee applicable.
- (b) 50% of INR fare applicable to foreigners resident in India for travel on Domestic Sectors. Full Inland Air Travel Tax and Passenger Service Fee applicable.

2. COMMUNICATION

(a) Postage

Payment of postage, both inland and foreign, for transmission by post of Blind Literature packets is exempted

if sent by surface route only. If packets are to be sent by air, prescribed air mail charges should be paid.

The relevant rule from the Post Office Guide is reproduced below:

Exemption from Postal Fees

1. 'Blind Literature' packets are exempted from the payment of postage and also for (i) registration fee, (ii) fee for acknowledgement, and (iii) fee for the attested copy of the receipt.
2. Postage free 'Blind Literature' packets will be transmitted by surface route only, and if they are to be sent by air, the air mail charge as prescribed for packets has to be paid.

Contents and Conditions of Posting

Papers any kind, periodicals and books printed in Braille or other special type for the use of the blind may be transmitted by post as 'Blind Literature' packets provided that they are posted in accordance with the following conditions:

Plates bearing the characters of writing, sound records for the use of the blind, and discs, films, tapes and wires on which spoken message for the blind have been recorded, when sent by, or addressed to, an officially recognised institution for the blind, shall also be treated as 'Blind Literature'

- (a) The packets shall consist only of articles specially impressed as described above for the use of the blind, and shall not contain any communication either in writing or printed in ordinary type, except the title and table of contents of the book or periodical and any key to, or instructions for the use of special type, or any enclosure except a label for the return of the packet.
- (b) The packet shall bear on the outside the inscription 'Literature for the Blind' and the written or printed name and address of the sender.
- (c) The packet shall be posted without a cover, or in cover open at both ends, which can easily be removed for the purpose of examination.
- (d) No 'Blind Literature' packet may weigh more than 7 kg.
- (e) 'Blind Literature' packets are subject to the same limits of dimensions as printed papers.

Penalty for Breach of Condition

Should any of the conditions mentioned above be infringed, the packet (unless it is admissible as an ordinary packet) will be charged on delivery with letter or parcel postage, whichever may be less.

Rule 304,305 and 306 in regard to definition of 'Blind Literature' Conditions and Exemption from Postal fees in respect of Foreign postage are the same as prescribed in rule 129 and 130 in regard to Inland Postage. However, the penalty for breach of conditions in respect of foreign postage is specified under Rule 307 -Penalty for Breach of Conditions:

'Blind Literature' packets which contain any note or document having the character of actual and personal correspondence, or which are not made up in such a manner as to admit of easy examination of the contents, or which contain postage stamps, form of pre-payment whether obliterated or not or paper representing any value, or which infringe any of the foregoing conditions will not be forwarded, but will be returned to the sender and will be charged on delivery with letter or parcel postage at the internal postage rate whichever is applicable. If the sender wishes to report the article after complying with the necessary conditions, he may do so. It is permissible in such cases to use the original wrapper, but the use of a fresh wrapper is preferable and is recommended.

(b) Telecommunication

Concessional Telephone Connection to Blind Persons

It has been decided to provide telephone facility to blind persons on concession and priority basis on the following terms:

Rental Rebate-50 percent of the normal rental.

Advance Rental-50 percent of the annual advance rental and bimonthly rental as applicable to a private

subscriber. This facility is available in Non-OYT (S) category only.

(c) Preference in Allotment of STD/PCO to Handicapped Persons

Educated unemployed persons are eligible for allotment of STD/PCOs. The educational qualification for the applicant is:

- VIIIth or Middle School Pass for rural areas.
- Atleast Matriculation or High School for urban areas.

(Notification No. 105/86 dated 17.2.86 Annexure Issued by the Deptt. of Revenue, Ministry of Finance)

The Central Government exempts goods specified below, when imported into India by a handicapped or disabled person for his personal use, from the whole of the duty of customs and the additional duty subject to the condition that the importer produces to the Assistant Collector of Customs, at the time of importation, a certificate from the Civil Surgeon of the District, Medical Officer or the Administrative Medical Officer or the Director of Health Services of the concerned State or a Specialist in the concerned speciality attached to a Govt. Hospital or a recognised medical college to the effect that the importer suffers from the particular handicap or disability and that the imported goods in respect of which the exemption is claimed are essential to overcome the said handicap or disability.

1. Braille writers and Braille writing equipment
2. Hand writing equipment, Braille Frames, Slates, writing guides, Braille Erasers, Script writing guides.
3. Canes, Electronic aids like the Sonic Guide.
4. Optical, Environmental Sensors.
5. Arithmetic Aids like the Taylor Frame (Arithmetic and Algebra Types) Cubarythm, Speaking or Braille Calculator.
6. Geometrical Aids like Combined Graph and Mathematical Demonstration Board, Braille Protractors, Scales Compasses and Spar Wheels.
7. Electronic measuring equipment, such as calipers, micrometers, comparators, gauges, blocks levels, and yard sticks.
8. Drafting drawing aids, tactile displays.
9. Specially adapted clocks and watches.
10. Orthopaedic appliances falling under Heading 90.21 of the First Schedule to the said Tariff Act.
11. Wheel Chairs falling under Heading No. 87.13 of the said First Schedule.
12. Artificial electronic Larynx and Spares thereof.

Institutions

As per notification C.S.R. No. 550 (E) dated 10.11.1978 issued by the Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Government of India, the Institutions (including Registered Co-operative Societies) for the Blind and the Deaf are permitted to import equipment and apparatus as below, being bonafide gifts to, as purchased out of donations received in foreign exchange by such insititutions from (i) the whole of the duty of customs leviable thereon under the first Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975); (ii) the whole of the auxiliary duty of customs leviable under sub-section (I) section 35 of the Finace Act; and (iii) the whole of the additional duty leviable thereon under section 3 of said Customs Tariff Act at the time of importation of such goods into India:

- (a) All tangible appliances for the blind.
- (b) Hearing aids and other audio-visual aids for the education of the deaf.
- (c) Vocational aids for the blind and the deaf.

- (d) Articles including instruments, apparatus, appliances, machinery and spares or component parts of accessories thereof required by such institution for the purpose of giving training or imparting instructions to the blind and the deaf.

Instructions

Where any such institution is scheduled to begin function only after the importation of the goods specified above the exemption shall not apply in respect of the goods imported by that institution, unless an undertaking in writing is given by the President or Secretary of that Institution that it will begin to function within a period of six months from the date of importation of the goods.

Provided that in any particular case, the aforesaid period of six months may, on sufficient cause being shown, be extended by the Collector of Customs concerned such further period as, he may deem fit.

Where goods have been purchased out of donations received abroad in foreign exchange, the institution has been permitted to maintain an account abroad by the Reserve Bank of India for the purpose of receiving funds donated overseas.

Exemption for Braille Paper

Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) vide their Notification dated 1st March, 1981, has exempted braille paper, falling under item No. 17 of the First Schedule to the Central Excise and Salt Act, 1994 (1 of 1994) from the whole of the duty of excise leviable thereon subject to the condition that such paper is supplied direct to a school for the blind or to a braille press against an indent placed by the National Institute for the Visually Handicapped, Dehradun.

Import of Audio Cassettes

Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) vide their Notification No. 379/86-Customs (F-14-839/86 C) dated 3rd July, 1986, has exempted audio cassettes, falling within Chapter 85 of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975) newspapers or magazines for the blind when consigned by an organisation and imported into India by an organisation:

1. The whole of the duty of customs leviable thereon, which is specified in the said First Schedule,
2. The whole of the additional duty leviable thereon under Section 3 of the said Customs Tariff Act subject to the conditions that-
 - (a) The audio cassettes so imported shall be re-exported within one year from the date on which these are imported into India or a such extended period as the Assistant Collector of Customs may allow,
 - (b) the importer executes an undertaking binding himself to pay an amount equal to the duty leviable on the audio cassettes at the time of import to the Assistant Collector of Customs in the event of failure to re-export the said audio cassettes within the period specified or. as the case may be. such extended period as may be allowed; and
 - (c) the importer produces the audio cassettes before the proper officer for identification before re-export.

4. CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

In accordance with the revised Orders No.F.19029/2/86-E.IV & F. 19029/ 1/ 89-E.IV dated 16.5.87 & 12.9.89 respectively. issued by the Ministry of Finance. Department of Expenditure. the Central Government employees who are on regular establishment (including work charged staff) and who are blind or orthopaedically handicapped (with disability of upper or lower extremities) are to be granted conveyance allowance at 5 percent of basic pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 100 p.m. subject to the following conditions:

- An orthopaedically handicapped employee will be eligible for conveyance allowance only if he/she has a minimum 40 percent permanent/ partial disability of either upper or lower limbs or 50 percent permanent/partial disability of both upper and lower limbs together.
- Conveyance allowance will be admissible to the orthopaedically handicapped employee on the recommendation of the head of Orthopaedic Department of a Government Civil Hospital.

- In the case of a blind employee the allowance will be admissible on the recommendation of the head of Ophthalmological Department of a Government Civil Hospital.
- Conveyance allowance is also applied to Central Government employees suffering from spinal deformity (generally known as hunch back disability) at the same rate as available to other Physically Handicapped persons.
- The allowance will not be admissible during leave (except casual level). joining time or suspension.

5. CHILDREN'S EDUCATIONAL ALLOWANCE

As per Office Memorandum No.21011/21/88-Estt(Allowances) dated 17.10.88, issued by the Ministry of Personnel Grievances & Pensions (Department of Personnel & Training), grant of children educational allowance, reimbursement of tuition fee, etc., to Central Govt. employees will be governed by the Central Civil Services (Educational Assistance) Orders, 1988.

Under this order, the reimbursement of tuition fee in respect of physically handicapped and mentally retarded children of the Central Govt. employee has been enhanced to Rs. 100 p.m. (from class I to XII) in comparison with general category where it restricts only to Rs. 40 p.m. The disabled children will however, get other assistance under this scheme as per rates prescribed for the other children.

6. SCHEME OF INTEGRATED EDUCATION FOR THE DISABLED CHILDREN

This is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme and was launched in 1974 by the then Department of Social Welfare. The Scheme has however been transferred to the Department of Education since 1982. Under the scheme, handicapped children are sought to be integrated in the normal school system. Hundred per cent assistance is provided to the States/UTs for education of the children suffering from certain mild handicaps in common schools with the help of necessary aids, incentives and specially trained teachers.

The following types of disabled children are covered under this scheme:

- (a) Children with locomotor handicaps (O.H)
 - (b) Mildly and moderately hearing impaired.
 - (c) Partially sighted children.
 - (d) Mentally handicapped-educable group (IQ 50-70).
 - (e) Children with multiple handicaps (blind and orthopaedic, hearing impaired and orthopaedic, educable mentally retarded and orthopaedic, visual impaired and mild hearing handicap).
 - (f) Children with learning disabilities.
1. The handicapped children are provided the following allowances and facilities under this scheme :
 - (a) Books and stationery allowance of Rs. 400 per annum.
 - (b) Uniform allowance of Rs. 50 per annum.
 - (c) Transport allowance of Rs. 50 per month (if a disabled child admitted under the scheme resides in a hostel of the school within the school premises, no transportation charges would be admissible).
 - (d) Reader allowance of Rs. 50 per month in case of blind children after class V.
 - (e) Escort allowance for severely handicapped children with lower extremity disabilities @ Rs. 75 per month.
 - (f) Actual cost of equipment subject to a maximum of Rs. 2,000 per student for a period of five years.
 2. In the case of severely orthopaedically handicapped children, it may be necessary to allow one attendant for 10 children in a school. The attendant may be given the standard scale of pay prescribed for Group 'D' employees in the States/U.Ts. concerned.
 3. Disabled children residing in school hostels within the same institution where they are studying may also be paid boarding & lodging charges as admissible under the State Govt. rules/schemes. Where there is no

State Scheme of Scholarships to hostelers, the disabled children, whose parents income does not exceed Rs. 3,000 per month, may be paid actual boarding & lodging charges subject to a maximum of Rs. 200 p.m.

4. Severely orthopaedically handicapped children residing in school hostels may need the help of a helper or an ayah, a special payor Rs. 50 p.m. is admissible to any employee of the hostel willing to extend such help to children in addition to his/her duties.
5. In a school in rural areas where at least 10 handicapped children are enrolled, capital cost for purchase of school rickshaw for free use of these children and expenses for Rickshaw Puller Rs. 300 p.m. will be provided under the scheme. In such cases, no transport allowance will be payable to the students.

7. INCOME TAX CONCESSIONS

Relief For The Handicapped

Section 80 DD: Section 80 DD provides for a deduction in respect of the expenditure incurred by an individual or HUF resident in India on the medical treatment (including nursing) training and rehabilitation, etc., of handicapped dependants. For officiating the increased cost of such maintenance, the limit of the deduction has been raised to Rs. 41,000.

Section 80 V: A new Section 80 V has been introduced to ensure that the parent in whose hands, income of a disabled minor has been clubbed under Section 64, is allowed to claim a deduction upto Rs. 40,000 in case of an individual who is suffering from a permanent disability (including blindness) or is subject to mental retardation.

Section 88 B: This Section provides for an additional rebate from net tax payable by a resident individual who has attained the age of 65 years, has been amended and a tax rebate of Rs. 10,000 has been allowed.

In his budget speech on 15th March, 1995, Sh. Manmohan Singh, Finance Minister, Govt. of India made the following announcements:

Deductions from the total income of handicapped persons under Section 80 V of the Income Tax Act has been raised from Rs. 20,000 to Rs. 40,000.

8. AWARD OF DEALERSHIPS/AGENCIES BY OIL COMPANIES

Award of Retail Outlet, 2/3 Wheeler Outlet, Kerosene-LDO Dealerships and LPG Distributorships

Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas has reserved 71/2 percent of all types of dealership agencies of the public sector oil companies for Physically Handicapped/Government personnel (other than Defence personnel) disabled on duty/widows of Government personnel (other than Defence personnel who die in the course of duty).

The oil industry appoints its dealers/ distributors through an advertisement in one English daily and one regional daily newspaper having maximum circulation in the district in which the dealership/distributorship is to be located.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Indian National
2. Age group (between 21 and 30 years)
3. Educational qualification (Matriculation or equivalent)
4. Physically Handicapped persons should produce a certificate from Civil Surgeon /CMO or Superintendent of a Government Hospital that he/ she is O.H. to the extent of min. 40 percent permanent, partial or either upper or lower limb or both upper and lower limbs together.

Partially HH candidates are also eligible. Totally blind persons are eligible to apply for retail outlet/kerosene/LDO dealership. They are however not eligible for LPG distributorship.

Income

The candidate's income should not be more than Rs. 50,000 p.a. Income for this purpose would include the income of the candidate, his/her spouse, dependent children put together. In case of dependent, his/her parents income would also be taken into consideration.

Application Form

Standard formats can be obtained from divisional /regional area office of the concerned oil companies.

9. RESERVATION OF JOBS AND OTHER FACILITIES FOR THE DISABLED PERSONS

(i) Three Percent Reservations in Grade 'C' & 'D' Posts

As per the order of Government of India reservation of 3 percent in jobs have been made in Grade 'C' & Grade 'D' posts for the PH persons. The category of handicapped persons benefitted are the blind, the deaf & the Orthopaedically Handicapped (O.H.) Persons, as given below:

Category of handicapped	Percent of reservation
(1) The Blind	1
(2) The Deaf	1
(3) The O.H.	1

For effective implementation of the reservation it has been advised to maintain a roaster of vacancies arising in Grade 'C' & Grade 'D' posts from year to year. The 34th vacancy may be earmarked for the blind. Similarly the 67th vacancy and 100th vacancy would be reserved for the Deaf and the O.H. respectively in a cycle of 100 vacancies.

(ii) Definitions of Disabled for the Purpose of Reservation

(1) **The Blind:** The blind are those who suffer from either of the following conditions:

- (a) Total absence of sight.
- (b) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses.
- (c) Limitation of the field

(2) **The Deaf:** The Deaf are those in whom the sense of hearing is nonfunctional for ordinary purposes of life. They do not hear and understand sounds at all events with amplified speech. The cases included in this category will be those having hearing loss more than 90 decibels in the better ear (profound impairment) or total loss of hearing in both ears.

(3) **The Orthopaedically Handicapped :** The orthopaedically handicapped are those who have a physical defect or deformity which causes an interference with the normal functioning of the bones, muscles and joints.

(iii) Identification of Jobs

In order to implement these reservation, without loss of productivity some posts are identified disability wise.

To ensure sufficient recruitment of blind persons, separate list has been identified for the blind and partially blind persons.

(iv) Posting of Handicapped Candidates

As per the decision of Government of India Grade 'C' & Grade 'D' posts recruited on regional basis and who are physically handicapped may be given posting as far as possible near to their native place within the region subject to administrative constraints. PH employees may be given preference in transfer case near to their native place.

(v) Relaxation of Ban Order on Recruitment to Vacancies Earmarked for PH Persons

As per the Government order regarding ban on filling up of non-operational vacant posts will not be applicable in case of reserve vacancies to be filled up for PH person.

(vi) Carry Forward of Vacant Posts Under Reserve Category

As per the Government order if a reserve category of person is not available or the nature vacancy in an office is such that the given category of person cannot be employed then the post may be carried forward for a period of three subsequent years.

(vii) Appointment of VI Persons as Caner in Government Department

As per the decision of Government of India it has been instructed that recaning of chairs in Government Offices should be done by blind persons as far as possible when the volume of work require a full time chair caner then a suitable post may be created in consultation with the Finance Department.

For the purpose of recaning the chairs in Government offices Vocational Rehabilitation Centres & Special Employment Exchange for the PH persons may be contacted.

(viii) Instruction to Appointing Authority for Intimating Vacancies Reserved for Handicap

As per the existing instruction of the Government all the vacancies in Grade 'C' & 'D' irrespective of their nature and duration are to be notified to the Employment Exchange and also to be filled through the agency unless filled through UPSC/SSC. It has also been decided that all the appointee should send their request to Employment Exchange/Special Employment Exchange/nearest Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for P.H. for nominating suitable handicapped persons.

(ix) Grant of Age Concession to PH Persons

As per the Government order it has been decided to extend the age concession of 10 years in favour of handicap persons to recruitment to posts filled through the SSC and through Employment Exchange in Grade 'C' & Grade 'D' posts.

(x) Relaxations in Typing Qualifications

As per the order PH persons who are otherwise eligible for appointment to posts of LDC but cannot be so appointed for being unable to satisfy the typing qualifications due to their disability may be exempted from the typing qualification for appointment.

(xi) Consideration for Confirmation in Job for Blind Persons

It has been instructed to all the Ministries/Departments of Government of India that there should not be any delay in confirmation of officers including blind persons on account of administrative delay. Ministry/Department should ensure, especially in which blind persons are employed that confirmation is made without delay and at appropriate time.

(xii) Reservation for PH Persons in Posts Filled by Promotion

As per the order handicapped persons may be promoted to Grade 'c' from 'D' and within Grade 'C' against the identified post if they are capable of being filled/held by the appropriate category of PH.

(xiii) Exemptions from Payment of Examinations Fee

As per the order PH persons recruited to Grade 'B' and Grade 'C' posts advertised by the UPSC and SSC will be exempted from the payment of applications and examination fee as prescribed by UPSC/SSC.

10. SPONSORSHIP POWER TO NATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

The Ministry of Labour in consultation with the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Department

of Personnel & Training has decided to grant co-sponsoring power to the National Level rehabilitation institutes as given below:

1. National Instt. for the Visually Handicapped. Dehradun.
2. National Instt. for the Mentally Retarded, Secunderabad.
3. Ali Yavar Jung National Instt. for the Hearing Handicapped. Mumbai
4. National Institute for the Orthopaedically Handicapped, Kolkata
5. National Institute for Rehabilitation Training & Research, Cuttack.
6. The Institute for the Physically Handicapped, Delhi

11. ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE

A Note Containing this Scheme has been Forwarded by the Department of Economic Affairs Vide D.O. No. F.301189-SCT (B), dated 8.9.89 to the Ministry of Social justice & Empowerment

(A) Public Sector Banks*

Under the Scheme of Public Sector Banks for Orphanages, Women's Homes and Physically Handicapped Persons the benefits of the differential rate of interest are available to physically handicapped persons as well as institutions working for the welfare of the handicapped. The details of the scheme are as under:

(i) Eligibility (For Individuals)

Physically handicapped persons are eligible to take loans under the scheme, if they satisfy the following conditions:

- Should be pursuing a gainful occupation.
- Family income from all sources should not exceed Rs. 7,200 p.a. in urban or semi-urban areas or Rs. 6,400 p.a. in rural area.
- Should not have land holding exceeding 1 acre if irrigated, and 25 acres if unirrigated.
- Should not incur liability to two sources of finance at the same time.
- Should work largely on their own and with such help as other members of their family or some joint partners may give them and should not employ paid employees on a regular basis.

(ii) Eligibility (For Institutions)

Institutions for the physically handicapped persons pursuing a gainful occupation are also eligible to take benefit under this scheme. The institutions are exempted from income criteria. However, these institutions could utilise the funds for productive purposes only and not for meeting their normal administrative and establishment expenses.

- Public Sector Banks refer to Nationalised Banks, the State Bank of India and its subsidiaries.

(iii) Assessment

The quantum of loan, both for working capital and for acquisition of fixed assets, will be determined on the basis of the needs of institutions/ individuals in a scientific method to ensure that all their legitimate financial requirements are met in toto.

(iv) Amount of Loan

The amount of loan will depend on the particular scheme proposed to be financed. It should be adequate to enable the borrower to finance his requirements without having to borrow funds from other sources. The normal limit will be Rs. 6,500 for working capital loan and Rs. 5,500 for a term loan. In exceptional cases, particularly for institutions, etc., higher amounts are allowed. Both the working capital and term loan are admissible

in accordance with the specific requirement of the borrower.

In the case of small scale industries, village artisans, etc., in decentralised sector advances under the scheme may be granted upto Rs. 6,000 without making any distinction between working capital and term loan by way of composite loan.

(v) Repayment

Term for the acquisition of fixed assets are normally allowed for five years, including a grace period not exceeding two years on the repayment of principal. The repayment schedule will be worked out in each case having regard to the nature of the activities of the borrower and the economics of the scheme. In assessing the surplus for the payment of interest and principal, due allowance is made for the sustenance requirements of the borrower himself.

(vi) Security

The borrower may not be able to offer tangible security to secure the loan. The viability or the potential viability of a project will be the main criteria for the grant of advance. However the assets purchased with the loan may be hypothecated to the Bank. In addition, in appropriate cases of loans to a homogeneous group of borrowers group guarantee may be accepted.

(vii) Margin

In the case of borrowers belonging to the weakest strata of society who may not be in a position to furnish margin money, requirements of margin money will not be insisted upon.

(viii) Rate of Interest

Keeping in view the social objective the interest will uniformly be charged @ 3 percent per annum, Physically handicapped persons including blind eligible under DRI Scheme are also given loans for purchasing of artificial limbs, hearing aids, wheel chair, etc., subject to maximum of Rs. 2,500 per borrower provided such assistance is given along with the advances for productive activities and self-employment ventures and all other requirements under DRI scheme are fulfilled.

Under the scheme of 'Financing Small Scale Industries' a special provision has been made to allow concession of 1/2 percent in the rate of interest to the physically handicapped availing working capital limit above Rs. 25,000 and upto Rs. 2 lakhs.

Repayment Medium Term Loan: 5 to 7 years including moratorium period of 6 to 12 months

(B) Subsidy to Handicapped Under the Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP)

Under the IRDP, 3 percent quota is earmarked for the Physically Handicapped persons. The Government has now decided that per family subsidy limit under the IRDP be raised from:

- Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 4,000 in normal areas.
- Rs. 4,000 to Rs. 5,000 in drought prone areas and desert development programme areas.
- Rs. 5,000 to Rs. 6,000 for Physically Handicapped beneficiaries.
